Sacramental Schedule

Reconciliation: Saturdays 11am-12pm, 4:15-4:45pm
Anytime in the rectory – call ahead

Baptism: most Sundays at 1:30pm.
Requirements: registration in parish, baptism preparation class, arrangements are made at least 3 MONTHS prior to the date of the baptism. Sponsors and Christian witnesses need verification of belonging to a Church.

Anointing of the Sick: anyone who is ill and or would like to receive Communion is asked to call the rectory.

Marriage: Couples planning marriage must notify the Parish Rectory at least ONE YEAR in advance for date and necessary info. Pre-Cana classes and F.O.C.C.U.S. Program etc. are required. At least one party must be a registered member of this parish.

Parish Membership

All new families who live within our boundaries are welcome to the parish. They are requested to register at the rectory. If a parishioner is not registered, it is difficult for us to issue testimonial letters, recommendations, references, etc. When you move or change your address please notify the rectory beforehand. Anyone 18 years of age/older not in school must be registered separate of their family. Thank you.

“The kingdom of heaven may be likened to a man who sowed good seed in his field...He who sows good seed is the Son of Man, the field is the world, the good seed the children of the kingdom.”

MATTHEW 13:24, 37-38

As children of God, we are all “good seeds.” We are blessed by God with the potential to accomplish much good in the world. We fulfill God’s plan when we spend time in prayer every day, use our skills to help others, and share our financial gifts to help build God’s kingdom on earth. Through our example of gratitude and generosity we sow “good seeds” on earth and ultimately help each other get to Heaven!

Reflection

Last weekend we heard the Parable of the Sower, which can be difficult scripture to relate to when you’re not a farmer. Father John kindly put this parable into modern day by giving us examples we can relate to our own lives. One question remains most important: what seed are you? Although we are not farmers, Jesus talks to us about sowing seeds. To bear good fruit, we must not let the Word of God fall on rocky ground or unfertile soil. Trying to enjoy your life is important but making time for your faith will always be the most important thing we can do to live a full life. Harvest and tend to your faith. This will help it to grow and flourish like the seed in the Gospel. So, what kind of seed will you decide to be?





This week we pray especially for married couples, may they embrace their call to total, faithful and fruitful love, and joyful openness to new life.




WATCH THE DOUGH GROW

Mix up some dough, or buy fresh or frozen pizza dough. Remember – we can't see the yeast working, but we know it's working as the dough rises.

Pizza time...

Dough (follow directions for purchased or mixed), Tomato sauce, about 8 oz. shredded cheese, optional – vegetables or pre-cooked meat

FAMILY PROJECT



Make the dough

- 1 cup warm (not hot) water
- 2¼ tsp. or 1 packet active dry yeast
- 2 tbsp. olive or vegetable oil
- 3 cups all purpose flour
- ½ tsp. salt

Mix water and yeast together in a large mixing bowl and let sit until the yeast becomes activated and begins to bubble/foam. Add the oil, flour and salt and mix well (add more flour if needed). Knead on clean floured surface a few minutes until it forms a ball. Oil a clean bowl and the dough surface. Cover dough and bowl with a towel and let rise in a warm place (about 1 hour).

Roll dough on a floured surface – place on baking tray covered with flour or bread crumbs. Spread on sauce, cheese and any other toppings you like. Bake at 400° for 10-15 minutes, or until done.
