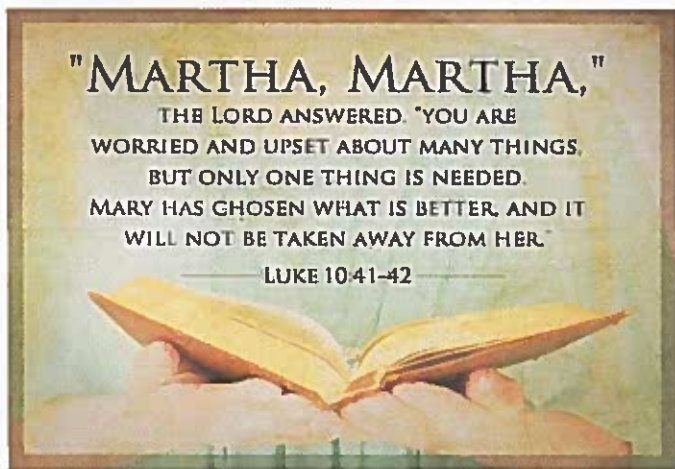

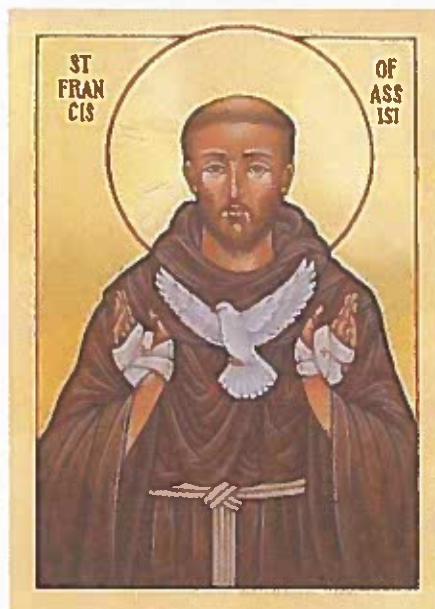

Auxiliary Bishop Robert F. Christian, O.P's Vigil service will be held on Monday, July 22, at 7:00 pm, in St. Dominic Church, 2390 Bush St. San Francisco. The funeral Mass will be on Tuesday, July 23, at 10:00 am, in St. Mary's Cathedral, 1111 Gough St., San Francisco. All are welcome to attend; a reception will follow the funeral Mass at the cathedral. The funeral liturgy will be livestreamed on the archdiocesan YouTube channel.

Bishop Christian was 70 years old. May his soul and the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Archbishop Salvatore J. Cordileone issued this statement on July 11: "Auxiliary Bishop Robert Christian has died unexpectedly at his residence at St. Patrick Seminary & University in Menlo Park. Bishop Christian was appointed rector of the Seminary on January 14 of this year. I was deeply saddened to learn this morning of his passing. The Archdiocese was greatly blessed to have his wisdom and leadership even if for so brief a time as auxiliary bishop and even briefer time as rector of the Seminary."

First Reading

Background on the Gospel Reading

The story of Jesus in the home of Martha and Mary complements the story of the Good Samaritan, which immediately precedes it in Luke's Gospel. Both stories are unique to Luke. The Samaritan is an example of how a disciple should see and act. Mary is an example of how a disciple should listen. Mary, a woman, is a marginalized person in society, like the Samaritan. Both do what is not expected of them. As a woman, Mary would be expected, like Martha, to prepare hospitality for a guest. Here again Jesus breaks with the social conventions of his time. Just as a Samaritan would not be a model for

neighborliness, so a woman would not sit with the men around the feet of a teacher.

Both stories exemplify how a disciple is to fulfill the dual command which begins chapter 10—love of God (Mary) and love of neighbor (the Samaritan). These are the two essentials of life in the kingdom. By using the examples of a Samaritan and a woman, however, Jesus is saying something more. Social codes and boundaries were strict in Jesus' time. Yet to love God with all one's heart and one's neighbor requires breaking those rules. The Kingdom of God is a society without distinctions and boundaries between its members. It is a society that requires times for seeing and doing and also times for listening and learning at the feet of a teacher.—*Loyola Press*

REFLECTION FROM POPE FRANCIS

Today's passage is that of Martha and Mary. Both offer hospitality to the Lord who is passing, but they do it in a different way. Mary places herself at Jesus' feet, listening. Martha, who allows herself to become absorbed by the things to prepare, is very busy. She turns to Jesus and says, "Lord, do you not care that my sister has left me by myself to do the serving? Tell her to help me". And Jesus answers, gently scolding her, "Martha, Martha, you are anxious and worried about many things. There is need of only one thing."

It is important to understand that this is not the contrast of two attitudes: listening to the Word of the Lord, contemplation, and practical service to others. They are not two opposing attitudes, but, on the contrary, both are two essential aspects to our Christian life, aspects that should never be separated, but lived in profound unity and harmony. Why is Martha rebuked, even if gently, by Jesus? Because she considered essential, only what she was doing, because she was too self-absorbed and preoccupied by things & by doing.

For a Christian, the works of service and charity are never detached from the main source of all our actions: listening to the Word of the Lord, being - like Mary - at the feet of Jesus, in the attitude of the disciple. And this is why Martha is reprimanded. This reflection on Luke's Gospel does not stop at that historical period or the circle of the disciples of the living Christ. Even in our Christian life dear brothers and sisters, prayer and action are always deeply united. A prayer that does not lead to concrete action towards the poor, sick, in need of help, is a sterile and incomplete prayer. -

REFLEXIÓN:

Primera Lectura - En esta lectura vemos como punto central la hospitalidad que brinda Abraham a Yavé y a sus dos acompañantes. Admírese esta narración tan sencilla: Dios con apariencia humana viene a pedirle la hospitalidad a su amigo antes de colmarlo de favores. Dios premió la hospitalidad del patriarca con la llegada de un hijo. (Abraham y su esposa Sara eran mayores). Así paga Dios cualquier gesto bueno.

Dentro de un año volveré para visitarte y Sara tu mujer habrá tenido un hijo.

Segunda Lectura - De Pablo a los Colosenses.- Pablo se siente una vez más orgulloso de haber sido designado para anunciar la Buena Noticia de Cristo, pero eso va unido a una identificación creciente de Pablo con Jesús, hasta llegar a aceptar el dolor como parte del camino de Jesús. El sufrimiento es un signo de la Cruz de Cristo. Pablo se alegra de sus penas y sufrimientos porque así completa en su carne lo que falta a la Pasión del Señor.

Evangelio según San Lucas - En este Evangelio se narra la visita que hace Jesús a Marta y su hermana María. En este escrito Marta ofrece a Jesús sus servicios materiales aun cuando el quiere entregarle las riquezas eternas. María en cambio representa al discípulo verdadero, porque no quiere nada, excepto a Cristo. Muchas veces también nosotros en nuestras vidas actuamos igual que Marta. Buscamos

cualquier excusa para no escuchar la Palabra de Dios, para no asistir a la Iglesia. Aquí Marta trabaja y se afana y no tiene tiempo de estar con Jesús. Pero si actuamos como María obtendremos la paz que Jesús nos ofrece.
