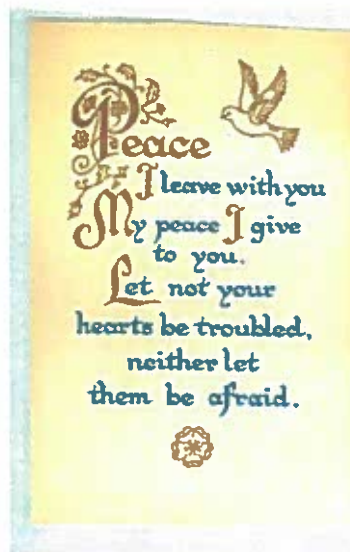

First Reading

Jeremiah 38:4-6,8-10

Jeremiah is punished for criticizing the wealthy for their corruption and their injustice to the poor.

Let us persevere in running the race that lies before us while keeping our eyes fixed on Jesus.

Gospel Reading

Luke 12:49-53

Jesus has come not only to bring peace but also division.

Background on the Gospel Reading

Having reminded the apostles and the crowd that facing the coming judgment takes patience, Jesus now goes on to speak of how difficult it will be to wait. He tells them that he has come to set the earth on fire. Recall that in chapter 3 of Luke's Gospel, John the Baptist tells the crowd that he is baptizing with water, but someone mightier is coming who will baptize with the Holy Spirit and fire.

The angels at Jesus' birth proclaimed peace on earth, and Simeon, holding the baby Jesus in the Temple, said to God: "Master, now you may let your servant go in peace." Here Jesus tells the crowd not to think he has come to bring peace;

he has come to bring division. Simeon said as much when he turned to Mary and said that the child was destined for the rise and fall of many and to be a sign that will be contradicted. Peace is the ultimate end of the Kingdom of God, but peace has a price. Jesus is warning the crowd that wherever the Word of God is heard and acted upon, division occurs. Fathers will be divided against sons and mothers against daughters.

The coming judgment forces us to look at the implications of our commitments. As Jesus warned in last Sunday's Gospel, a commitment of faith requires us to change our attitude toward material possessions and to take even more seriously our moral responsibilities. Here he reminds the crowd that those who commit to him will find it affects the way they relate to friends and family members. The angel who announced the birth of John the Baptist to Zechariah said John would go before Jesus to turn the hearts of fathers toward their children. But a commitment to Jesus forces us to change the way we live our lives, and this can put strains on relationships.

We don't expect to hear such difficult words from Jesus in the Gospel. But it is good to be reminded once in a while that the decision to do the right thing, the good thing, is not always easy and without conflict. Jesus himself did not make easy decisions and avoid conflict. In today's reading, he reminds his followers to be prepared for difficult decisions and conflict as well.

REFLEXIÓN:

Primera Lectura - Del profeta Jeremías.-En esta lectura es el propio Jeremías quien nos narra sus sufrimientos y vejaciones sufridas ante los discursos que daba al pueblo alentándolo a que luchara por justicia, igualdad, reconciliación. Debido a esto lo acusaban de incitar al pueblo, desmoralizar a los soldados y que él no buscaba el bien del pueblo sino solo su desgracia. Ante esta situación lo quisieron matar pero fue salvado por el rey.

Segunda Lectura - De la carta a los hebreos.- Se habla de luchar contra el pecado, a no desalentarnos, a no ceder. Tener presente que en Cristo hemos tenido un ejemplo de tenacidad. Es una ocasión privilegiada porque permite demostrar a Cristo el propio amor y la fidelidad. Dar testimonio de fe, fuerza y valor.

Evangelio según San Lucas - El evangelio de hoy es muy distinto a los muchos evangelios que hemos escuchado. Y escucharlo en boca de Jesús, por primera vez nos asustaría y después de haberlo escuchado más de una vez, seguiría provocando en nosotros desasosiego.

HE VENIDO A PRENDER FUEGO EN EL MUNDO Y OJALA ESTUVIERA ARDIENDO. Y lo dice el que más tarde dirá: "la paz os dejo, mi paz os doy."
