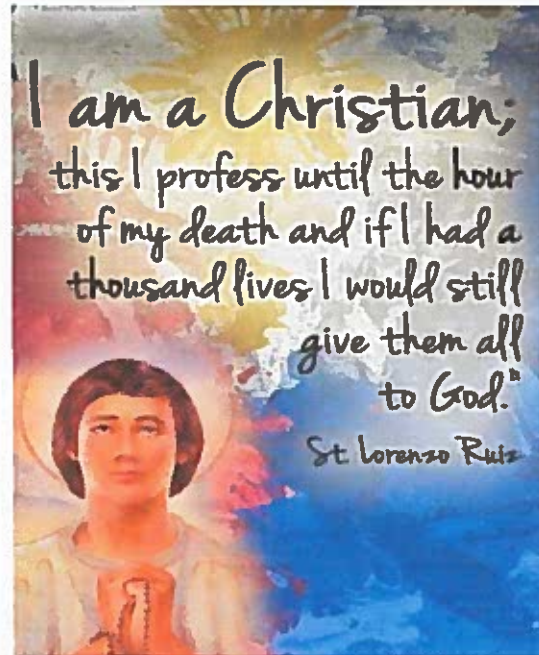
Jesus tells the parable of the reversal of fortunes between the rich man and the poor man, Lazarus.

**Background on the Gospel Reading**

A major theme in the Gospel of Luke is the importance of the care of the poor in the life of discipleship. In the parable found in today's Gospel, Jesus contrasts the life of a rich man and the poor man, Lazarus, who lives in the shadow of the rich man and his wealth. Both die. Lazarus finds himself in heaven; the rich man in the netherworld. The rich man asks for assistance from Lazarus in his torment. But Abraham reminds the rich man of the good things he had in his life and describes the current situation as a reversal of fortunes. The rich man then asks that Lazarus be sent to warn his family, but this is denied with the reminder that Moses and the prophets have warned of judgment for those who neglect the care of the poor.

In the context of Luke's Gospel, this parable, delivered in the presence of a crowd of listeners, is part of Jesus' response to some Pharisees. These Pharisees are described in Luke's Gospel as "loving money." Jesus observed that the actions of some Pharisees betrayed misplaced priorities: they spoke one way, but acted in another. The story of the rich man and Lazarus demonstrates the importance of the care of the poor and is a reminder to those who would follow Jesus of the unimportance of wealth in the eyes of God. -Loyola Press

**REFLEXIÓN:**

Primera Lectura – Del libro del profeta Amós.- En esta lectura vemos que el profeta Amós, considerado como el profeta de la justicia social sigue proclamando su palabra contra las injusticias, el lujo, la avaricia, etc. El lujo hace olvidar los desastres del pueblo dice Amós y él tampoco soporta el lujo de los ricos que lo hacen en base a la explotación del pobre. Seamos como el profeta Amós: *" Levantar la voz para denunciar cualquier injusticia o abuso que veamos."*

Segunda Lectura De San Pablo a Timoteo - En esta lectura Pablo sigue alentando a Timoteo que siga con su vida de rectitud que nuestro Señor ha escogido para él. También en esta lectura Pablo expone las virtudes que debe poseer el servidor ideal. Las pautas que señala Pablo van también para nosotros y más en estos momentos históricos, tienen mayor vigencia.

Evangelio según San Lucas - En esta lectura Jesús nos da la parábola del rico y Lázaro. La parábola tiene un mensaje muy humano. Lázaro representa al pobre en todo el mundo; el rico al potentado, al poderoso pero el que ha hecho toda su fortuna a través de la explotación, injusticias. Esta parábola no se sugiere por el odio hacia los ricos, sino por una preocupación sincera de su salvación. La división central del rico y del pobre es muy común en nuestra vida. Mientras el pobre sufre vejaciones, maltratos etc. el rico con su poder va construyendo una pared que será su perdición cuando muera y será un abismo que no podrá salvar. Y esto lo vemos en esta lectura donde el rico suplica a Abraham un poco de misericordia. La cosa más odiosa en esta historia para Jesús, es la ostentación del rico que hace alarde de su riqueza sin miramiento hacia el pobre. Con miras de salvar

tanto al rico como al pobre, el Evangelio nos pide suprimir los abismos que nos separa.

*Dios quiere salvar al rico de su riqueza.*
