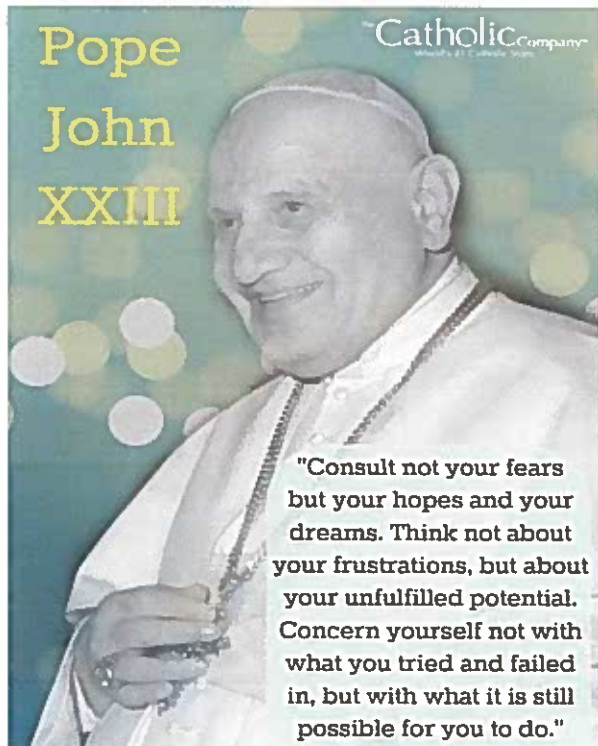

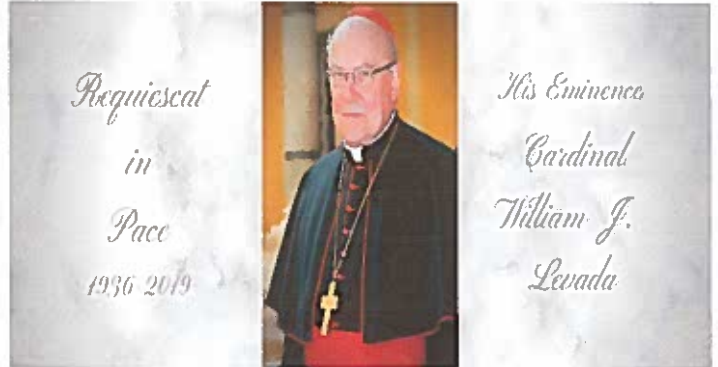

Background on the Gospel Reading

In today's Gospel we hear Jesus teach about faith and service to God. The context is a continuing dialogue between Jesus and his followers about what it means to be a disciple of Jesus. Jesus has just finished an instruction on sin and forgiveness. There are two related teachings that Jesus offers to his disciples when they cry out for an increase in faith. The first is the familiar reminder that faith, even just a little, will enable the followers of Jesus to do wondrous things. But this uplifting and inspiring teaching is quickly followed by the second teaching, a caution about knowing one's place in God's plans. The disciples of Jesus are to understand themselves as servants to God and his plans is God's grace to us—nothing more, nothing less. When we are graced enough to cooperate with God, the work we do is nothing more than our obligation to God as faithful stewards. And

yet, our faith enables us to believe that what we have offered in service to God, as his servants, can be made to produce a hundredfold.-*Loyola Press*



**October 7th Feast
Day- The Story of
Our Lady of the
Rosary**

Saint Pius V established this feast in 1573. The purpose was to thank God for the victory of Christians over the Turks at Lepanto—a victory attributed to the praying of the rosary. Clement XI extended the feast to the universal Church in

1716. The development of the rosary has a long history. First a practice developed of praying 150 Our Fathers in imitation of the 150 Psalms. Then there was a parallel practice of praying 150 Hail Mary's. Soon a mystery of Jesus' life was attached to each Hail Mary. Though Mary's giving of the rosary to Saint Dominic is recognized as a legend, the development of this prayer form owes much to the followers of Saint Dominic. One of them, Alan de la Roche, was known as "the apostle of the rosary." He founded the first Confraternity of the Rosary in the 15th century. In the 16th century, the rosary was developed to its present form—with the 15 mysteries: joyful, sorrowful and glorious. In 2002, Pope John Paul II added five Mysteries of Light to this devotion.

The purpose of the rosary is to help us meditate on the great mysteries of our salvation. Pius XII called it a compendium of the gospel. The main focus is on Jesus—his birth, life, death, and resurrection. The Our Fathers remind us that Jesus' Father is the initiator of salvation. The Hail Mary's remind us to join with Mary in contemplating these mysteries. They also make us aware that Mary was and is intimately joined with her Son in all the mysteries of his earthly and heavenly existence. The Glory Bes remind us that the purpose of all life is the glory of the Trinity. The rosary appeals to many. It is simple. The constant repetition of words helps create an atmosphere in which to contemplate the mysteries of God. We sense that Jesus and Mary are with us in the joys and sorrows of life. We grow in hope that God will bring us to share in the glory of Jesus and Mary forever.-*Franciscan Media*

REFLEXIÓN:

Primera Lectura – Del profeta Habacuc. Este profeta tiene una forma muy peculiar de propagar la palabra de Dios ya que a la vez que proclama, cuestiona sobre tanta injusticia en el mundo. Habacuc puede ser considerado como el primero de los escritores de la Biblia que transmite y pregunta con osadía sobre tanta maldad que existe en el mundo. Pero el Señor le hace ver que todo esta escrito. El mal sucumbirá y pide que espere el momento de la visión. Si tarda espera, porque ha de llegar.

Segunda Lectura - De Pablo a Timoteo. En esta lectura Pablo sigue pidiendo a su hermano en Cristo, Timoteo, a entregarse por completo a Dios, con la seguridad de que los esfuerzos serán premiados. La fe junto con el amor es la fuerza que hace posible el anuncio de la Buena Noticia. Dios no nos da un espíritu cobarde, sino un espíritu de energía, amor y buen juicio para que propaguemos su palabra.

Evangelio segun San Lucas - En este Evangelio el punto principal es la fe. Los apóstoles le piden a Jesús que los ayude a aumentar su fe. Jesús tras animar a los discípulos a alcanzar una fe duradera, la propone como fundamental del servicio cristiano. Tener fe en algo, eso nace con nosotros ya que la recibimos de Dios, que ha salido a nuestro encuentro y que se ha servido de otros medios para darnosla. Nuestra pertenencia a una institución como la Iglesia y nuestra presencia en el lugar de acción litúrgica, no se entienden sin fe. La fe es algo que puede aumentar, disminuir e incluso morir.
