First Reading

Sirach 35:12-14,16-18

God hears the prayer of the poor.

Responsorial Psalm

Psalm 34:2-3,17-18,19, 23

The Lord hears and answers the cry of the poor.

Second Reading

2 Timothy 4:6-8,16-18

Paul perseveres in faith, confident that God will rescue him.

Gospel Reading

Luke 18:9-14

Jesus tells the parable of the proud Pharisee who prayed from his self-importance and the tax collector who prayed humbly.

Background on the Gospel Reading

The second parable that Jesus tells in Luke 18 addresses attitude in prayer. In contrasting the prayer of the Pharisee with the prayer of the tax collector, Jesus teaches his disciples to pray in humility before God. Jesus again surprises his listeners by showing the tax collector as the example of faith, rather than the Pharisee. Remember that Pharisees taught an oral interpretation of the Law of Moses as the basis for piety. If anyone would be a model for prayer, a Pharisee was a likely candidate. In contrast, Jesus offers the tax collector as a model for prayer. Tax collectors were collaborators with the Roman authorities in a system that allowed the tax collectors to line their own pockets by charging in excess of the defined taxes. Yet, in this parable, Jesus offers the humility of the tax collector as a model for the prayer of a disciple. The parable

reminds us that when we pray, we must remember our need for God in our lives. If we are too full of ourselves, there is too little room for God's grace to work in us.-*Loyola Press*

**All Souls-November 2nd; How to Pray the
Chaplet of the Holy Souls**

(This version of the chaplet can be prayed using any rosary.)

After making the sign of the cross while holding the crucifix of the rosary, say the Apostles' Creed.

On the first large bead, pray the Our Father.

Pray three Hail Mary's on the following three beads. Pray the Glory Be.

On the large beads before each decade pray the following prayer:

O Holy Souls

*draw the fire of God's love into my soul,
to reveal Jesus Crucified in me here on earth,
rather than hereafter in Purgatory.*

**Then on the small beads pray this prayer:
*Crucified Lord Jesus,
have mercy on the souls in Purgatory.***

At the conclusion of the chaplet, pray 3 Glory Be prayers.

REFLEXIÓN:

Primera Lectura – Del libro del Eclesiástico. Esta lectura que tiene enseñanzas muy profundas, nos dice que para Dios todos somos iguales. Nos dice que la oración es el medio más eficaz para llegar a El, pero esa oración debe ser con fe y humildad. En esta lectura vamos a escuchar un discurso divino en favor de los más débiles y humildes.

Segunda Lectura - De Pablo a Timoteo. En semanas anteriores hemos escuchado muchas cartas que Pablo ha enviado a su amigo y hermano en Cristo, Timoteo, donde le pedía que continuara con la fe y la propagación de la Palabra. Hoy en esta lectura se termina la lectura de las cartas de Pablo a Timoteo, y además con una página que es como la despedida y el testamento de Pablo ante la inminencia de su final. Pablo sabe que no recobrar su libertad y será condenado a muerte. Ahora solo espera por el premio de su lucha y perseverancia en pro del Evangelio. En sus últimos mensajes dice: *Predicar la Palabra es la primera preocupación de la Iglesia y de cualquier responsable a cargo de una Iglesia.*

Evangelio Según San Lucas - La historia en este Evangelio nos hace ver a dos tipos diferentes de personas. Después de escuchar esta lectura pensemos a cual de los dos pertenecemos. El fariseo personifica a una persona que se cree perfecta. A la persona que se cree en orden con Dios y los hombres y desprecia al prójimo. El publicano por su parte representa a la persona que se ha equivocado y pide por ello humildemente perdón a Dios. Mediante esta parábola Jesús nos presenta el criterio de Dios que mira al interior y lee en el Corazón de quien a él se dirige en oración. En

nuestra vida diaria dejemos a un lado al fariseo, que más que alabar a Dios se alaba a sí mismo. Seamos como el publicano, humildes, sinceros, misericordiosos para que podamos recibir la gracia y el perdón de Dios.

Todo el que se enaltece será humillado y el que se humilla será enaltecido.
