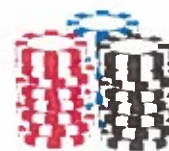

Background on the Gospel Reading

In Jesus' day, tax collectors were not popular people. The tax system allowed them to charge more than what was required so that they could make a profit for themselves. Observers in the crowd that day grumble because Jesus dines with a sinner. Even before Jesus comes to his home, Zacchaeus shows himself to be someone in search of salvation. Zacchaeus, described as short in stature, climbs a tree in order to see Jesus. We know from Luke's description that Zacchaeus was no ordinary tax collector; he was, in fact, the chief tax collector and a person of some wealth. In his search for salvation, he humbled himself by making a spectacle of himself by climbing a tree. Jesus recognizes the faith of this tax collector exhibited in his search for salvation and calls

him down from the tree. In the hospitality he extends to Jesus and in his conversion of heart, Zacchaeus is raised up by Jesus as a model of salvation. -*Loyola Press*

El no ha perdido el sentido del bien y secretamente admira a Jesús. Y es por eso que lo busca y para su sorpresa Jesús le promete ir a su casa. Por compartir con él, Jesús es criticado pero a eso el Señor no le da importancia porque El vino con el amor y perdón de Dios a salvar a los pecadores. Con su presencia Jesús cambia radicalmente la forma de pensar de Zaqueo y lo convierte en un hombre de fe y una vez más Cristo ha demostrado su fuerza: *ha destruido el mal salvando al pecador.*
