Background on the Gospel Reading

Today as a Church, we conclude our liturgical year and celebrate the Feast of Christ the King. The Gospel we proclaim shows the great mystery of our faith: In the moment of his crucifixion, Jesus is shown to be King and Savior of all.

Luke's Gospel has been loaded with surprises: the poor are rich, sinners find salvation, the Kingdom of God is found in our midst. Here we see the greatest surprise of all. We are confronted with the crucified Jesus, whom faith tells us is King and Savior of all. The irony is that the inscription placed on the cross, perhaps in mockery, contains the profoundest of truth. As the leaders jeer, the thief crucified by his side recognizes Jesus as

Messiah and King, and finds salvation. Jesus is King, but not the kind of king we might have imagined or expected. His kingship was hidden from many of his contemporaries, but those who had the eyes of faith were able to see. As modern disciples of Jesus, we, too, struggle at times to recognize Jesus as King. Today's Gospel invites us to make our own judgment. With eyes of faith, we, too, recognize that Jesus, the crucified One, is indeed King and Savior of all.-*Loyola Press*

REFLEXIÓN:

Primera Lectura - Del Libro de Samuel. Esta lectura demuestra el triunfo de David al ser reconocido como rey de Israel. David es visitado por los dirigentes de las diferentes tribus y le piden que sea su rey. De esta forma se produce la unidad en todo el país. David conquista Jerusalén y la hace su capital y Dios la designa para ser el centro visible de su presencia entre los hombres.

Segunda Lectura - De Pablo a los Colosenses - En esta lectura Pablo dice que todo fue hecho alrededor de Cristo ya que es la imagen del Dios que no se puede ver. Cristo fue entre nosotros imagen del Padre y de su misericordia y sus acciones nos revelan la manera de pensar y de actuar de Dios.

Evangelio según San Lucas - La solemnidad de Nuestro Señor Jesucristo Rey del Universo (Cristo Rey) cierra el año litúrgico en el que se ha meditado sobre el misterio de su vida, su predicación y el anuncio del Reino de Dios.- La fiesta de Cristo Rey fue instaurada por el Papa Pío XI para motivar a los católicos a reconocer en público que el mandatario de la Iglesia es Cristo Rey. Jesús en sus últimos días de vida fue cuestionado y hasta se burlaron de Él porque su pueblo lo consideraba Rey. Aun el mismo Pilato en su interrogatorio le preguntó si era Rey a lo que le responde: *Mi Reino no es de este mundo. Si mi Reino fuese de este mundo, mi gente hubiese combatido para que no fuese entregado a los judíos.* Esta fiesta de Cristo Rey muestra a Cristo como el Rey bondadoso, sencillo, que como Pastor guía a su Iglesia peregrina hacia el Reino Celestial.
