

Sunday, January 12th, 2020

### First Reading

*Matthew 3:13-17*


The Spirit of God comes upon Jesus as he is baptized by John.

### Gospel Reflection

Jesus' baptism reminds us of our mission: a) to experience the presence of God within us, to acknowledge our own dignity as God's children, and to appreciate the Divine Presence in others by loving them and serving them in all humility; b) to live as the children of God in thought, word and action so that our Heavenly Father may say to each one of us what He said to Jesus: "You are my beloved son/daughter with whom I am well pleased"; c) to lead a holy and transparent Christian life and not to desecrate our bodies (the temples of the Holy Spirit and members of Jesus' Body) by impurity, injustice, intolerance, jealousy or hatred; d) to accept both the good and the bad experiences of life as the gifts of a loving Heavenly Father for our growth in holiness; e) to grow daily in intimacy with God by personal and family prayers, by reading the Word of God, by participating in the Holy Mass, and by frequenting the Sacrament of

Reconciliation; f) to be co-creators with God in building up the "Kingdom of God" on earth, a Kingdom of compassion, justice and love, and to be the salt of the earth and the light of the world.

This is the day for us to remember the graces we have received in Baptism and to renew our Baptismal promises: On the day of our Baptism, as Pope John Paul II explains, "We were anointed with the Oil of Catechumens, the sign of Christ's gentle strength, to fight against evil. Blessed water was poured over us, an effective sign of interior purification through the gift of the Holy Spirit. We were then anointed with Chrism to show that we were thus consecrated in the image of Jesus, the Father's Anointed One. The candle lighted from the Paschal Candle was a symbol of the light of Faith which our parents and godparents must have continually safeguarded and nourished with the life-giving grace of the Spirit." This is also a day for us to renew our Baptismal promises, consecrating ourselves to the Holy Trinity. Let us ask Our Lord today to make us faithful to our Baptismal promises. *Fr. Antony Kadavil*

**INTENCIÓN:** Hoy Domingo recordemos a nuestros amigos y hermanos que han pasado a mejor vida en especial: Mary Remier, María Dolores Montano, Darío Montenegro, Dora Courtade, Netzali Can. Qué nuestro Señor los tenga en su santa gloria.

*Onmediatamente después de que Jesús recibió el bautismo, se abrieron los cielos y el Espíritu Santo se posó sobre Él en forma de paloma, y resonó la voz del Padre que decía: "Este es mi Hijo amado, en quien he puesto todo mi amor".*

**REFLEXIÓN:**

Primera Lectura - Del Profeta Isaías. En esta lectura el profeta Isaías nos dice que el siervo de Yahveh traerá el derecho y la justicia a los pueblos. Enseñará a las naciones mis juicios, es decir, mis decisiones para realizar la justicia en el mundo. Abrirá a los ciegos los ojos o sea que a las personas incrédulas les dará fe y a los cautivos que habitan en las tinieblas los librará. Todo esto lo hará con mansedumbre y fortaleza.

Segunda Lectura - Del libro de los Hechos de los Apóstoles. En esta lectura, Pedro en su discurso nos dice que para Dios todos somos iguales. Lo que nos dice Pedro son cosas muy sencillas. Que Jesús pasó haciendo el bien en nombre de Dios, murió y resucitó. Qué debemos creer? Que Jesús nos consigue el perdón de los pecados y vendrá a juzgarnos.

Evangelio según San Mateo - Hoy Domingo celebramos la fiesta del Bautismo del Señor, y esto sucede una semana después de Epifanía y con la cual culmina el ciclo de Navidad y comienza el Tiempo Ordinario. Jesús llega al Jordán para ser bautizado por Juan. Este no quiere hacerlo pero Jesús le dice que es necesario para que así se cumpla lo que es justo. El bautismo de Jesús es el comienzo de su ministerio público. Esta escena del Bautismo del Señor es impactante, pues vemos a Jesús, Dios hecho hombre que no tiene pecado, pero que en un gesto de humildad hace fila para ser bautizado por Juan. El bautismo de Jesús nos tiene que llevar a reflexionar sobre nuestro propio bautismo. Es cierto que lo hicieron nuestros padres, fieles a su fe y tradición cristiana. Pero ahora la lucha es tratar de preservar a que los jóvenes acepten el bautismo. Y ese es el trabajo de

los padres, catequistas, sacerdotes, acentuar la importancia de la renovación de las promesas del bautismo. Cuando nosotros somos bautizados, somos bautizados en el Espíritu de Jesús y Dios nos considera sus hijos.
