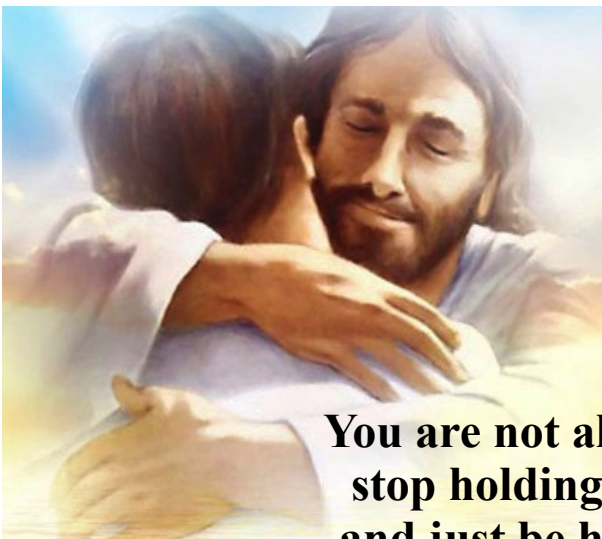
A few years ago, one of my friends was on retreat and she called me. She told me that the Priest had a favorite word and she wanted to see if I could guess what it was. I immediately responded "behold". My friend was in disbelief that I had guessed the priest's word! My response to her was this: "tell Father that after years of praying with 'behold', I have come to realize how often I hear it as "be held".
