How has the COVID-19 crisis affected your program and community?

All communities where families and program offices are located were locked down under the enhanced/general community quarantine.

- Offices and business establishments were closed.
- Travel is not possible due to lack of public transportation.
- Children below 21 years old and adult persons 60 years and above are not allowed to go outside their homes.
- The school year had to end unexpectedly. Graduating students and those moving up [a level] missed out on their once-in-a-lifetime finishing ceremonies.
- Public gatherings are banned, including in-person meetings.
- Families lost their income because of no work and no pay, and businesses were not allowed to operate.

Today, it looks like employees have returned to work at the office, but only at 50% capacity.
