## From the Wellness Ministry...

*Free Flu vaccines for Seniors  
from the AA County Health Department*

Free Fluzone High-Dose flu vaccine available for people age 65 and older. By appointment only. Glen Burnie Health Center: 410-222-6633 Parole Center: 410-222-7247. Supplies are limited.

A flu vaccine is needed annually, because flu viruses are constantly changing. The flu vaccine is formulated each year to keep up with the flu viruses as they change. Studies have shown that the body's immunity to influenza viruses (acquired either through natural infection or vaccination) declines over time.

The flu vaccine is recommended for everyone 6 months and older and is covered by insurance and Medicare. The Health Department recommends contacting your primary care provider for the vaccine, or if you are a senior contact your local health center.

The best ways to avoid the flu are proper hand washing, the flu vaccine and staying away from sick people.

Middle School Youth Ministry

Last Monday, Nov. 2nd, we had a special session on **All Saints and All Souls Days**. We talked about what a good role model was, and who are the students' role models. The Saints in the Church are also our role models, to help inspire us to be better Christians, and we especially remember them on All Saints Day. On All Souls Day, we especially remember and pray for all our loved ones who have died (and who also may be role models for us), in the hopes that like the Saints, they too have gone to heaven and are with God...and that we will see them again!

This Monday, Nov. 9th, from 4:30pm to 6:00pm, we will explore **Advent: How to Make Christmas Even Better**. All 6th, 7<sup>th</sup>, and 8<sup>th</sup> grade students are welcome and encouraged to join us!

We have **homework** every week (just a few minutes worth). The students will not only bring a copy home with them, but we will also **e-mail** the homework to parents this year, and it is usually on our website ([www.olchesapeake.org](http://www.olchesapeake.org)). Thanks!

On Friday, Oct. 30<sup>th</sup> about 25 of our 6<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> grade students went on our **annual Halloween Trip**. We went laser-tagging in Columbia, and then on to the Wicked Woods at Arthur Slade school in Glen Burnie. We had a terrific time! Thank you to the parents who drove and chaperoned...we would not have had a trip without you!

High School Youth Ministry

Our Sunday evening faith formation meetings for **Session 1** have ended! Our theme for the five weeks was "**Self-Portrait**"; we investigated various areas of our lives (values, personality, obstacles, fears and dreams), and investigated how we work our faith into our self-portraits.

This past Sunday, Nov. 1st, we focused on **Fears and Dreams**. We had a "Feud of Fear" contest, where the students identified common fears shared by people (Fear of: failure, not being in control, being laughed at, being wrong, being excluded/alone, being different, being hurt (emotionally), disappointing parents, the future, death or a loved one dying). We talked about our dreams for the future, and that fear is arguably everyone's biggest obstacle in life because it keeps us from realizing our full potential (image of God). We then examined the story of Jesus and Peter walking on water during the storm (Matthew 14: 22-33). We all have a comfort zone around us in which we like to live. It is safe and "comfortable" within our comfort zone. Fear keeps us from leaving our comfort zone. In this scripture passage, the boat is the disciples' comfort zone, and the storm that they fear is symbolic of everything we fear that keeps us in our comfort zones – like the answers to our Feud of Fear. Like the scripture passage, Jesus comes to us in the turbulence of life, and asks us to step out of the boat, to step out of our comfort zones, in order to help others, and to make us reach our full potential...our Image of God! However, leaving our comfort zone requires taking risks. When we step out of the boat (comfort zone), we WILL sink sometimes; but Jesus promises us that he will be there to take our hands and help us up. When our dreams fail or are not realized, God helps us set new dreams! In this scripture passage, people often look at Peter as a failure for sinking. But at least Peter got out of the boat...he took a risk! There were eleven guys that stayed in the boat, and stayed in their comfort zone!

We will be on break for the next few weeks. On Sunday, Nov. 29th, from 6:30pm to 8:30pm, we will begin Session 2 entitled "**Advent: Being a Disciple**." All high school students are welcome and encouraged to join us!

Our **Fall Retreat** is approaching – November 13<sup>th</sup>-15<sup>th</sup>. We are heading to the Hashawha Environmental Center in Westminster, MD...we turn it into a spiritual center! Our theme will be "**We Walk by Faith**"...it will be fun, relaxing, AND inspirational! Please keep us in your prayers as we prepare for retreat.

Wednesday Night Group

Our Wednesday Night Group is a **voluntary faith formation group** for high school students. If you are in 9<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade and you're interested in pursuing your faith beyond what we do Sunday evening, AND in a relaxed setting, come join us please! (Note: Our Sunday evening meetings are wonderful with great content; the WNG is more relaxed, and yet deeper discussions.) While we have evenings of deep discussion on matters of faith, current events, and prayer, we also include evenings of community building, such as games, fun field trips, and service. And we've got some GREAT EATS! The schedule for the Sept.-Dec. has been e-mailed to parents, and we will post here in the bulletin the upcoming month's schedule.

So, if you are in 9<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade, come join us please Wednesday evenings from 6:30pm to 8:30pm. Here's our schedule for the next month.
