### From the Desk of Sister Sally

Luke 18:1-8

1. Is the Pharisee saying the prayer to God or to himself? If you were in God's place, which kind of prayer would you answer first? Of the two praying, which one has a sincere heart?
2. According to Pope Francis, God has a weakness for the humble ones, and their prayers open God's heart wide. Which heart can God fill with his mercy, the humble empty one, or the one that keeps track of all his/her good deeds and his/her neighbors' misdeeds?

Dear Brothers and Sisters:

In our continuing catechesis for this Holy Year of Mercy, we now turn to the parable of the Pharisee and the Tax Collector (Gospel). Jesus contrasts the arrogance and self-righteousness of the Pharisee's prayer with the tax collector's humble recognition of his sinfulness and need for the Lord's mercy. True prayer is born of a heart which repents of its faults and failings, yet pleads for the grace to live the great commandment of love of God and neighbor. Indeed, the proud disdain of the Pharisee for the sinner at his side prevents him from being righteous in God's sight. To pray well, then, we need to look into our own hearts and there, in humble silence, let the Lord speak to us. The honesty and humility which God asks of us is the necessary condition for our receiving his mercy.

Middle School Youth Ministry

Last Monday, Oct. 17<sup>th</sup>, we continued our first four-week session of the year about “**The Marks of the Church. - One, Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic.**” This week we explored what it means to be **CATHOLIC**. This is “catholic” with a lowercase ‘c’, which is referring to the Church being “universal” (Catholic with an uppercase ‘C’ is referring to Roman Catholic). After exploring Matthew 28: 16-20, we discovered the first powerful way that the Church is “catholic” or “universal” is that wherever you find Truth, there you find Jesus, and wherever you find Jesus, the head of the Church, there you also find his body, the Church. So other religions, where they have Truth in their faith, there they have Jesus (even if they are not aware of it), and thus are part of the Church (even though not fully). The second powerful way that the Church is “catholic” or “universal” is that we are on a mission to bring Jesus to the whole world, and his message that God loves them all! Let us be clear...we would not be successful in our mission without the help of the Spirit of Christ...it is the Holy Spirit who makes us CATHOLIC!

This Monday, Oct. 24<sup>th</sup>, we continue our investigation into The Marks of the Church as we look at **APOSTOLIC**...and how that impacts our everyday lives. And while doing that we will continue to have a great time! Come join us from 4:30-6:00pm.

The students will not only bring a copy home with them, but we will also **e-mail** the homework to parents this year, and it is usually on our website ([www.olchesapeake.org](http://www.olchesapeake.org)). High School Youth Ministry

Our Sunday evening faith formation meetings for Session 1 are underway! Our theme for the five weeks is “**Personal Audit**,” we are evaluating various aspects of our lives (Priorities, Time, School, and the Future) to see how our lives right now compare to how God wants us to live our lives as followers of Christ.

This past Sunday we investigated **SCHOOL**. After playing a game involving helping and hindering, the students discussed their academic experience with high school – what causes them pressure (homework, classwork, pressure to cheat, pressure to get good grades, etc.), and where that pressure comes from (themselves, parents, teachers, classmates). While grades are certainly important, our focus in school should be about **LEARNING** (usually good grades will naturally follow). School is all about a search for knowledge. Even if you don't go to college, or when you graduate from college, that search for knowledge won't end for you...it is a lifelong endeavor. Some students are so focused on getting good grades that they resort to cheating (and even justify it)...but there is no learning through cheating. Be honorable young women and men; not only take pride in your work, but live so that you can take pride in yourself.

The more we desire to learn, the more that desire spills over into all aspects of our lives, including wishing to learn more about Jesus the master; to learn more from Jesus the teacher; which allows us to fall in love with Jesus the savior. The word “disciple” even comes from the Greek word that means “to learn.” Being a disciple is also a lifelong learning process...so savor learning!

**This Sunday, Oct. 23<sup>rd</sup>, from 6:30pm to 8:30pm** we will complete our exploration into ourselves, and who Jesus wants us to be...you don't want to miss it! All high school students are welcome and encouraged to join us!
