From the Desk of Sister Sally

The Gospel is ever new

1. A man climbs a tree in order to see. A holy man goes to a "sinner's" house for dinner. A repenting person gives half of all his possessions to the poor. How do you explain these events? Does knowing Jesus Christ elicit extraordinary behavior from you? What?
2. How does Pope Francis use the story of Zacchaeus to help the UN develop goals that impact the "structural causes of poverty and hunger, attain more substantial results in protecting the environment, ensure destructuralized and productive labor for all, and provide appropriate protection for the family"?

It is the encounter between Jesus Christ and the rich tax collector Zacchaeus, as a result of which Zacchaeus made a radical decision of sharing and justice, because his conscience had been awakened by the gaze of Jesus. This same spirit should be at the beginning and end of all political and economic activity. The gaze, often silent, of that part of the human family which is cast off, left behind, ought to awaken the conscience of political and economic agents and lead them to generous and courageous decisions with immediate results, like the decision Zacchaeus. Middle School Youth Ministry

Last Monday, Oct. 23rd, we completed our first four-week session of the year about “**The Marks of the Church. - One, Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic.**” This week we explored what it means to be **APOSTOLIC**. Jesus commanded his original apostles to teach other followers what Jesus taught them. But the original apostles knew that they would not live forever. So whenever one of them died, they would get together and select a replacement, who was taught the original message of Jesus. These “apostles” became known in the Church as “bishops”, and as the Church grew, so did the number of bishops. The bishops were responsible for making sure that Jesus’ message remained pure; they had to make sure that they were always teaching the followers of Jesus the message of the Master. As the Church grew, the areas for which bishops were responsible also grew, and the bishops needed help meeting the spiritual needs of the people, so they started ordaining men to help them...that is where priests came from. Even priests rely on the help of religious and lay people who are well trained to pass along Jesus’ teaching as understood by our bishop (like Deacon Rick, Sr. Sally, Mrs. Stacey, and Mr. Tim). So, “Apostolic” ensures that whoever gets the teaching is getting Jesus’ teaching. Apostolic helps our faith to remain ONE. Apostolic helps the message to remain HOLY. Apostolic helps make our mission CATHOLIC. Fr. Raff even joined us at our meeting and shared with the students his own vocation story...how he decided and became a priest.

This **Monday, Oct. 31st we DO NOT HAVE CLASS**. The following Monday, Nov. 7th, we will begin our second session of the year entitled “**Living Your Baptism**”...and we will discover how our baptisms impact our everyday lives. And while doing that we will continue to have a great time! Come join us from 4:30-6:00pm. On Friday, Oct. 28th our 6th-8th graders went on our **annual Halloween Trip**. We went laser-tagging in Columbia, and then back to OLC for a Halloween movie and pizza and snacks. We’ll let you know next week how it went.

High School Youth Ministry

Our Sunday evening faith formation meetings for Session 1 have ended. Our theme for the five weeks was “**Personal Audit**,” we evaluated various aspects of our lives (Priorities, Time, School, and the Future) to see how our lives right now compare to how God wants us to live our lives as followers of Christ. This past Sunday we concluded our investigation with the **FUTURE**. We investigated James 4: 13-16, and discovered that James is NOT telling us we don’t have to plan for the future. He is NOT telling us we can just sit back and wait for God to show us what to do with our lives. But he IS telling us to plan and work hard to make our plans/dreams come true – but NEVER lose sight that God is in control of the big picture, not us. Our planning for the future SHOULD include God. He knows what is best for us, and He has our best interests in mind because he is crazy in love with us. Trust Him! Ask God “Help me to figure out what you want me to do with my life.” If you desire peace in your life, seek out God’s will for you! Realize that discerning what you should do with your life is a long process, so your prayer asking God for help should be one you say every day...as you also get in tune with yourself, your gifts, your talents, and seek the advice of trusted people who love you dearly too. If your plans or dreams don’t come true, maybe God has something else, something even better, perhaps, in store for you. So always be open to God’s will for your life. St. Elizabeth Ann Seton said, “If it succeeds, I bless God. If it does not succeed, I bless God, because then it will be right that it should not succeed.” Regardless of whether you factor God into your future plans or not, there will be times when things don’t go your way and you get knocked down. Knowing that God loves you and is on your side...knowing that His will is guiding you can help you get up and dust yourself off quicker. That’s what’s in it for you!

We will be on break Sunday evenings until we resume again on Nov. 27th, when we begin Session 2. Last week the students offered their input to our topic for Session 2, which is not set yet. But...it will have everything to do with working your faith into your everyday lives! All high school students are welcome and encouraged to join us! Our **Fall Retreat** is approaching – November 4th-6th. We are heading to the Hashawha Environmental Center in Westminster, MD...we turn it into a spiritual center! Our theme will be “**Baptism – Dive In to the Family of God**”...it will be fun, relaxing, AND inspirational! Permission forms were due last Sunday. Please keep us in your prayers for a great retreat experience.
