Dear Friends of Our Lady of the Chesapeake,

This weekend we celebrate the Solemnity of Pentecost, the official end of the Easter Season. It is also sometimes called the birthday of the Church, as it is the celebration of the Holy Spirit coming down upon Mary and the disciples gathered together in the upper room, as Jesus promised would happen. The Holy Spirit empowered the early Church to boldly and fearlessly proclaim the good news of Jesus Christ to all people, and many of them died as martyrs doing this very work. We are called to continue this work as well: to fearlessly proclaim Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior by our words and our actions.

Last week OLC launched GiveCentral, our new e-giving program. GiveCentral is a low cost, convenient way for you to make your financial contributions to our parish. There are many benefits to OLC for you to use GiveCentral including saving money on offertory envelopes, helping us with budgeting, and reduced paperwork with processing your offerings. You can set up an account and link it directly to your checking account or a credit/debit card. You can also choose from all of the various donation options such as weekly stewardship, deferred maintenance, special collections and the poor box. I have used e-giving for many years and have linked it to my Southwest Visa card in order to earn air miles. I believe it is a win-win for all of us! To enroll, go to givecentral.org, click on "Start Giving", enter "Our Lady of the Chesapeake", select us from the list, and begin setting up your account. Thank you for using GiveCentral.

In consultation with the Finance Committee, OLC will be modifying our weekly second collection. Currently the second collection envelope is Deferred Maintenance (sometimes there is also an envelope for an Archdiocesan Collection as well). This summer, we will be adding Evangelization Support as well. Deferred Maintenance and Evangelization Support will rotate every other week. Evangelization Support donations will be used to support our religious education, youth ministry, and sacramental preparation programs. Thank you for your support of these worthwhile ministries, which in many ways, are at the core of the New Evangelization.

Please keep our Confirmation candidates in your prayers and they go through their final days of preparation for receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation on May 22nd.
