The Pastor's Page

Dear Friends of Our Lady of the Chesapeake,

This weekend, we are beginning our journey through the Gospel of John, Chapter 6, which is known as the Bread of Life Discourse. Throughout the next four weeks, we will hear about Jesus' declaration that he is the Bread of Life, the bread that came down from heaven, the living bread that is his flesh and blood. As Catholics, we see in these passages Jesus' very clear teaching concerning the Eucharist. The bread and wine offered at Mass becomes for us the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ: true food and true drink. If we really want to be in communion with Jesus, it happens whenever we eat his flesh and drink his blood through our reception of the Eucharist.

During these weeks, I invite you to reread the Gospel of John, Chapter 6 at home and reflect upon Jesus' words. If we really believe we receive Jesus' flesh and blood in the reception of the Eucharist, how ought this weekly encounter change us? How do we prepare to receive Jesus in the Eucharist each week? Do we experience this encounter as an intimate encounter with God? Do we feel it transforms us and strengthens us to be Jesus' disciples in the world? The Second Vatican Council stated that the Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life. May we make receiving the Eucharist the source and summit of our weekly lives as well.

Next month OLC is beginning to rotate our Deferred Maintenance collection with the Evangelization Support collection. Money donated for Deferred Maintenance is used for the repair and maintenance of our parish buildings, which is certainly something we must continue to do; however, OLC also needs to be able to afford to offer our programs and staffing needs. Contributions to the Evangelization Support collection will assist with that. So please be as generous as your means allow for evangelization support. It would go a long way to help OLC's budget needs.

OLC is also reducing rental expenses for parishioners to use the Gathering Place for birthday and anniversary parties and other family events. I want the Gathering Place to be available to our parishioners, please consider using it. Call Donna Moran at the parish office to book an event. If you have any questions or concerns about a rental, please let me know.

Feeding the Hungry

The prophet Elisha fed a hundred people with twenty barley loaves, and there were leftovers. Jesus fed about five thousand with five barley loaves and a couple of dried fish, and there were leftovers. That is God's desire for us: everyone should find food in abundance.

Today's reality is different. Every three days more people die from malnutrition and disease than from the bombing of Hiroshima, and every year more people die from preventable hunger than died in the Holocaust, even though we grow enough grain in the world to provide every man, woman, and child with a satisfactory diet of 3000 calories.

The Second Reading from Ephesians tells us to "make every effort to preserve the unity which has the Spirit as its origin and peace as its binding force." The problem with the world is its fragmentation; it lacks unity and peace.

The problem is not with God's providence, for God has provided us with enough food for everyone, and then some.

The problem is the divisions in the world that prevent food from getting to people or keep people away from the food.

God has given blessings to the world: if only we could learn to use those blessings for the benefit of all.

Since there are so many people in this world afflicted with hunger, this sacred Council urges all, both individuals and governments, to remember the saying of the Fathers: "Feed the man dying of hunger, because if you have not fed him you have killed him."

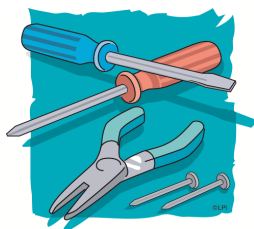
Middle School Youth Ministry
