Dear Friends of Our Lady of the Chesapeake,

This weekend, our readings encourage us to desire wisdom and to live as the wise do. Wisdom has spread a table before us and invites us to eat and drink from this table. Jesus is seen as the Wisdom of God, and wisdom is one of the gifts of God's Holy Spirit. In addition, a title for the Blessed Mother is also Seat of Wisdom, as she is the woman who gave birth to Wisdom itself in Jesus Christ. It is Wisdom that helps us to understand and accept Jesus' teaching that he is the Bread of Life, and that his flesh is true food and his blood true drink.

We have lots of things happening in the coming weeks at OLC. First you might have noticed a gravel circle out by the gazebo. This is the start of an Eagle Scout project by one of our parishioners. He is building a fire pit to be used for prayer and fellowship by our parish. (I am planning to use it during the Blessing of Animals on Oct. 7<sup>th</sup>.) OLC is sponsoring a Fundraising Night at Texas Roadhouse on Sunday Aug. 26<sup>th</sup> AND Monday, Aug. 27<sup>th</sup>. Please plan to eat dinner there one of those nights and OLC will receive back 10% of your total food purchase. To participate, please pick up an invitation flyer at church and present it at the restaurant.

On Wednesday, August 29<sup>th</sup>, OLC will once again be sponsoring a guest speaker from Catholic Relief Services. Dr. Lucy Steinitz will be here to share her global experiences working to prevent and respond to human trafficking – the abuse and exploitation of children and vulnerable adults. We are especially encouraging middle and high school aged students and parents to attend. The talk will begin at 7:00pm in The Gathering Place.

I am also very excited to share with you that I will be trying a "message series" homily this fall, beginning Sept 8<sup>th</sup> through Oct. 14<sup>th</sup>. The theme of the series is "Be Open" and the homilies will be linked by this common theme of inviting us to Be Open to Christ in different ways. This theme will also be incorporated into our religious education, MSYM, HSYM, and adult formation activities throughout the 6 weeks. So, mark your calendars and invite a friend to come and "Be Open" to Christ this fall at OLC!

And finally, remember, **the 10:30am Mass moves to 10:45am starting September 16<sup>th</sup>**! This will help to accommodate the move of Religious Education to in between the Sunday Masses (9:35am-10:40am) starting that same day.

## ***From the Desk of Sister Sally:***

### **Becoming Food**

The Eucharist is a sacrament of unity, primarily the unity of Christ with the Christian: "The [one] who feeds on my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me, and I in him; by this sacrament you make us one with Christ." This unity reflects the unity of the Son with the Father in the Trinity.

The reading from Ephesians encourages the Church to reflect in its life the unity of the Trinity: Christians are to walk in the Spirit and give thanks to the Father in the name of Jesus Christ.

The alternative opening prayer speaks of a larger unity, the unity of the whole human race: "May the walls, which prejudice raises between us, crumble." Prejudice and discrimination destroy the unity that the Trinity and the Eucharist symbolize for us and challenge us to achieve.

The Christian commitment is clearly on the side of unity: that is the wisdom revealed in scripture. The divisive wisdom of the world is really foolishness, and the author of Ephesians warns us not to act like fools. Gerald Darring, Creighton University

**Our Lady of the Chesapeake presents Lucy Steinitz on Wednesday, August 29th at 7pm speaking on Human Trafficking**



Dr. Lucy Steinitz serves as Senior Technical Advisor for Protection at Catholic Relief Services (CRS). She came to CRS in 2014 after living for 17 years with her family in Africa (mostly Namibia and Ethiopia). Lucy concentrates on efforts to prevent and respond to the abuse and exploitation of children and vulnerable adults worldwide through local capacity-building, project development, and technical support. Most recently, she has been directly involved on combating human trafficking in India, family-strengthening in Uganda, post-Ebola recovery in Sierra Leone, and promoting trauma-healing in Zimbabwe, South Sudan and Latin America. Human trafficking is an evil that impacts us even locally. Come hear Lucy's story and discover how you can make a difference here in the Dena.

### High School Youth Ministry AND Confirmation



Our HSYM Program (Sunday evening faith formation meetings) will be starting before you know it! **Our first Sunday night class with Opening Mass will be on September 23rd from 6:30pm - 8:30pm** (parents are encouraged to attend and celebrate with us. The beginning of our HSYM program is synonymous with the beginning of our Confirmation process.

**Active participation in our HSYM program for two (2) consecutive years is part of our process before candidates are confirmed.**

Our Confirmation process begins with a series of Intake Sessions for the First and Second year students (even if you attended one last year). The entire Family Team – student and parent (and sponsor too if you are a Second year student) – needs to attend the same meeting. You only need to attend one meeting as a family team. The available Intake Sessions will be held on:

- **Tuesday, Sept. 12th from 7-9pm**
- **Saturday, Sept. 16th from 9-11am**
- **Sunday, Sept. 17th from 5-7pm**
- **Tuesday, Sept. 19th from 7-9pm**

Please note the different times, and remember you only attend ONE meeting as a Family Team.
