

From Deacon John...

Today's dialogue between Jesus and a woman from Samaria is among the most lengthy and most theological found in Scripture. Jesus, an observant Jew, was expected to avoid public conversation with women. The animosity between the Jews and the Samaritans should have prevented the conversation as well. The woman herself asks: "How can you, a Jew, ask me, a Samaritan woman, for a drink?" Yet Jesus not only converses, he also asks to share her drinking vessel, an unclean act according to Jewish law. The significance of the encounter has many levels. The woman is converted to belief in Jesus. Second: the Samaritan woman becomes an evangelist to her own people. Third: Jesus uses his encounter to teach that God's mercy is without limit.



Pope offers live-broadcast Mass for those suffering from coronavirus

Pope Francis celebrated Mass at Casa Santa Marta which was broadcast live in order to demonstrate his nearness to those affected by the Covid-19 virus.

VATICAN CITY (VNS) Yesterday, the Director of the Holy See Press Office announced that Pope Francis had decided that his 7:00 morning Mass would be broadcast in these days.

This morning, Pope Francis introduced the liturgy saying “In these days, I will offer Mass for those who are sick from the coronavirus epidemic, for the doctors, nurses, volunteers who are helping them, for their families, for the elderly in nursing homes, for prisoners”. He then asked everyone to “pray together this week” the words of the entrance antiphon: “Redeem me, O Lord, and have mercy on me. My foot stands on level ground; I will bless the Lord in the assembly”.

The Pope then reflected on the first reading of the Second Monday of Lent from the Book of the Prophet Daniel (9:4-10). He characterized it as a “confession of sin”.

The people recognized that they had sinned. ‘We have sinned, been wicked and done evil; we have rebelled and departed from your commandments and your laws. We have not obeyed your servants the prophets, who spoke in your name to our kings, our princes, our fathers, and all the people of the land.’ This is a confession of sin, a recognition that we have sinned.

Preparation for the Sacrament of Reconciliation

Pope Francis went on to describe that “when we prepare ourselves to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation, we have to do what is called an

‘examination of conscience’ “. He then differentiated between a list of sins done on an intellectual level and the heartfelt recognition of sin. It is not correct, the Pope said: *to make a list of sins in the mind, to say ‘I’ve sinned’, then say them to the priest and then the priest forgives me. That’s like drawing up a to-do list or things I need to have or what I’ve done wrong. This remains in the mind. A true confession of sins must remain in the heart.*

Moving from the mind to the heart

The Pope invites us to take a step forward so that we confess our “misery, but from the heart.... This is what Daniel, the Prophet, did: ‘Justice, O Lord, is on your side; we are shamefaced’ “.

When I realize that I have sinned, that I haven’t prayed well, and I feel this in my heart, a sense of shame comes to us... Being ashamed of our sins as a grace we need to ask for. A person who has lost a sense of shame has lost a sense of moral judgement, has lost respect for others. The same thing regarding God.... ‘O LORD, we are shamefaced, like our kings, our princes, and our fathers, for having sinned against you. But yours, O Lord, our God’, first he said justice, now he said ‘compassion’.

We touch God’s heart

When a sense of shame is added to the memory that we have sinned, “this touches God’s heart”, Pope Francis explained. The sense of shame leads us to experience God’s mercy. Our confessions, then, will not consist in reading a list of sins, but in realizing

what we “have done to a God who is so good, so compassionate, so righteous”.

Cardinal Newman’s legacy on University campuses

Cardinal John Henry Newman pursued truth with such tenacity that he opened himself up to rejection and put his reputation on the line when he entered into communion with the Catholic Church in 1843. It was in Ireland in 1852 that he expounded his thoughts on the fundamentals of and advantages of a university education. Later, these lectures were integrated into a work that is synonymous with Newman: *The Idea of a University*. Two years later, he became rector of the newly founded Catholic University of Ireland in Dublin.

Cardinal Newman’s presence on the university campus endured even after his death in 1890. Only three years later, the first Newman Club was founded on the campus of the University of Pennsylvania. Just after the turn of the century, many American Catholic university clubs formed a formal association.

Currently, the Newman Connection website lists 1,486 Newman Centers in the United States alone. These Centers have provided and continue to provide pastoral care to Catholic university students and to the communities in their area.

Place to call home

Due to this network that takes its name from the recently canonized English cardinal, Cardinal Newman is perhaps more well-known in the United States than in his native country. These centers are present in contexts that are not specifically Catholic. They are a catalyst in a reality where students run a high risk of isolation and risky behavior as they take their first steps away from their families.
