From Deacon John...

John proclaims, "Behold, the Lamb of God", a reference to the Jewish sacrificial offering at Passover thus revealing Jesus as Savior. When the two with John heard this, they immediately followed Jesus. He turned and asked, "What are you looking for?" They responded, "Rabbi, where are you staying?" Imagine Jesus asking you, "What are you looking for?" We might respond with a better job, more kids, or any number of things that we think will make life better. Those things may be righteous, but as disciples, first we seek the Kingdom. If we strive to respond by seeking Jesus first, we will not be disappointed. Andrew had the gift of meeting the Lord and did not hoard it. Instead, he sought his brother and proclaimed what he had experienced. This reminds us our call is to be missionary disciples sharing what we have found.

Background on the Gospel Reading

We are familiar with the title that John the Baptist uses for Jesus—the Lamb of God. We sing it at the breaking of the bread during Mass. For those who heard John the Baptist, however, this title recalled key themes from the Old Testament. It alludes to the paschal lamb offered as a sacrifice when God freed the Israelites from slavery in Egypt, the event that is commemorated by the Jewish Passover celebration. The designation also recalls the prophet Isaiah’s description of the suffering servant of Israel. In using this name for Jesus, John the Baptist predicts Jesus’ passion and death and the new interpretation of Passover that will begin with Jesus’ Last Supper.

We learn in today’s reading how Jesus’ first followers were gathered. The first two, Andrew and another man, were followers of John the Baptist. After hearing John’s testimony, they became followers of Jesus. During their time with Jesus, the details of which are not specified, Andrew and the other follower came to believe that Jesus was the Messiah. Andrew then brings his brother, Simon, to Jesus. Immediately, Jesus gave Simon a

new name meaning “rock” in Greek. The renaming of Simon to Peter is reported in all four of the Gospels.

In the exchange between Andrew, the other disciple, and Jesus, we see an example of the usual pattern for first-century Jewish rabbinical schools.

Jews sought out rabbis and established themselves as disciples of a particular rabbi. Jesus appears to have been unique in that he sought out individuals, inviting them to be his followers. In the passage that follows, John’s Gospel tells us how Jesus took the initiative in calling Philip and Nathanael.

Jesus asks Andrew and the other disciple, “What are you looking for?” This is a telling question, and one that we might often ask of ourselves. John the Baptist testified to Jesus’ identity,

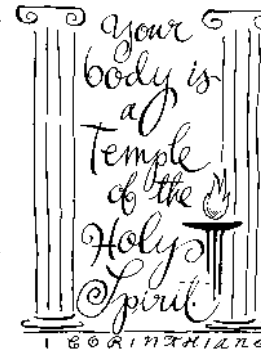

the Lamb of God, using the framework of the Old Testament. Andrew, Simon, and the other first disciples were looking for the Messiah, whom they also came to know as the Son of God. What do we look for and what do we find in Jesus?

A Stewards Perspective

Our First Reading unfolds the relationship between Samuel and the Lord. Samuel, who is serving under the priest Eli, hears Eli call him while he is sleeping. Samuel goes to Eli, yet Eli is not the one who is calling him. This happens three times before Eli realizes it is the Lord calling. Eli encourages Samuel to respond next time with, “Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening.” If we put ourselves in Samuel’s shoes, we can wonder how many times the Lord has spoken to us but did not understand.

God might already be present in the quiet of our hearts, in Scripture, or even in speaking through someone else. He speaks to us in various forms, but to recognize that it is Him, we must give Him a portion of our time by being still and listening to what He is calling us to do or not do. Once Samuel responded he “grew up, and the Lord was with him.” Yet, without Eli, would Samuel have ever understood the Lord was speaking? Eli was a good steward of his wisdom and knowledge of the Lord. Often, we find ourselves in circumstances where we could share our knowledge of the Lord. Yet, we hold back. We cannot allow opportunities to share our faith pass us.

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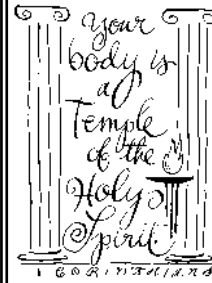
