**MISSION CO-OP
OF THE DIOCESE OF HAMILTON**



This weekend, October 15th and 16th, Father Sutherland MacDonald, C.R., will preach at all the Masses as part of the Mission Co-op of the Diocese of Hamilton and will preach on behalf of the Resurrectionist Missions. The first missionary effort of the Congregation of the Resurrection was to St. Agatha, Ontario in the 1850's. Today, the Congregation has missions in South America, Eastern Europe and Africa. Father MacDonald served in Rome as Superior General of the Congregation and is responsible for the opening of the Resurrectionist Mission in Tanzania, East Africa in the year 2000. Currently, he is retired and lives in Louis Hall at St. Jerome's University.
