*Wisdom 11:22-12:2 2 Thessalonians 1:11-2:2 Luke 19:1-10*

### THE TRIUMPHANT ZACCHAEUS

Jesus took Zacchaeus where he was and such as he was – a grown man out on a limb, mildly curious. Jesus simply called Zacchaeus, and Zacchaeus came scrambling. Now he was face to face (more or less) with Jesus, who invited himself over to Zacchaeus' house. Zacchaeus jumped at every command and invitation from Jesus. He was like a hungry man, a drowning man, or a desperately searching man. When Zacchaeus invited Jesus home, Zacchaeus saw his chance, and he seized it. That's part of it. The other is that Zacchaeus had to reorient himself. He had to do some things – clean up after himself, sort of. He promised he would give away what stood in the way. In Zacchaeus' small human self, God's imperishable spirit triumphed. That is how it goes and that is why today's responsorial psalm is so lively and welcome: "I will praise your name for ever, my king and my God." This song is for God. This song is for us.

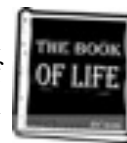
