FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

MASS INTENTIONS

The custom of giving offerings to have Masses said for a specific intention is an ancient and important part of life for a Catholic community. Since the 8th century, the faithful have made offerings to the Church to have the Eucharist celebrated for intentions like the repose of a deceased loved one or in thanksgiving to God. At St. Anthony Daniel Parish, we are pleased to facilitate this devotion through our parish office, where Mass intentions can be arranged during regular office hours.

The practice of recording intentions and celebrating the corresponding Masses is tightly controlled by Canon Law to prevent some of the abuses that marked the period prior to the Protestant Reformation. For instance, once an intention is accepted and associated with a particular Mass, *no additional intention may be added to that celebration.*

Beginning January 1, 2017 the following guidelines will direct our acceptance of Mass intentions:

- Each parishioner may request up to five (5) single-intention Masses per calendar year.
- Parishioners desiring more than five (5) Masses in a given year may add their intentions to our regularly scheduled multiple intention Masses (Tuesdays 7:00 p.m., Saturdays 5:00 p.m.)
- Once an intention is accepted for a Mass, *no further intention may be added to that Mass, without exception.*

These guidelines are intended to ensure a broad participation in this practice from all parishioners. No changes will be made to Mass intentions already booked.

Often those particularly devoted to this practice may desire more than five Masses celebrated for their intentions in a given calendar year. Apart from joining one of our multiple-intention Masses, the parish is also able to offer “unannounced” intentions. These single-intention Masses are celebrated here in the parish when a Mass intention is needed (or sometimes offered to retired or Mission priests in need of intentions). They are offered solely for the requested intention, but are not scheduled and announced in the usual way, though Mass cards are still provided.

As always, parishioners are encouraged to be patient with one another and our office staff. If the date you're looking for is not available, please consider another one in close proximity.
