**SOLEMNITY OF THE
BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST**

June 2, 3, 2018

Exodus 24:3-8 Hebrews 9:11-15 Mark 14:12-16, 22-26

THE EUCHARISTIC COVENANT

This solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ leads us to ponder unity and what it brings about and what it costs. In this breaking and in this pouring out life is given and life is secured. On celebrating the Eucharist, we enter into this covenant, we are one with the Risen Lord in His death as well as His life. This truth is difficult to make our own. In the early Church, Paul had to remind his new converts of this. At times, their celebrations of the Eucharist became betrayals of life-giving. In Corinth, the well-to-do shared a lavish “eucharistic” meal and excluded or ignored the poor. Paul reminded his parishioners that they had entirely missed the whole point: “Every time, then, when you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the death of the Lord until He comes!” (1 Corinthians 11:26). These words are echoed Sunday after Sunday in the Memorial Acclamation. “When we eat this bread and drink this cup, we proclaim Your death, Lord Jesus, until you come in glory.”
