ONE LAST THING

Jesus lamented the rich man's departure and drew on an old saying to illustrate the difficulty of carrying a burden of wealth into the kingdom. The impossibility of the camel slipping through a needle's slender eye equals the impossibility of this rich man slipping into the kingdom of God. One can imagine the camel, God's serviceable, homely creature of considerable bulk, carrying a considerable load, to boot. And one can see the slender, shining needle and its thin eye. The point is taken. The squeeze was impossible. The rich man carried a considerable load, an absorbing, soul-crushing burden. But, rich or poor, we carry burdens that hold us back. We hang on to any number of "one-last-things" that, left unattended, fester and swell to camel-size and lock us out of the kingdom of God.

In today's gospel, the apostles were quick to see that we all tend to clutch onto some last thing, some willed blind spot, some silly stubbornness, some favourite sin. These are effective blocks to the entrance into the kingdom. Our tiny, loved last thing has effectively burdened us, stripped us of a certain nimbleness of spirit, dulled us to God's call to follow.

"WALK A MILE IN THEIR SHOES"

This year, *Development and Peace* is striving to bring greater attention to the world's refugee crisis. Refugees flee their homelands when no other options remain; when staying would otherwise lead to displacement or death. As an act of solidarity with the world's 68.5 million forced migrants, *Development and Peace* would like the collective "we" to walk the circumference of the Earth (40,075km) by August 31, 2019.

St. Anthony Daniel Parish will be participating in this collective walk on **October 21st after the 10:30 a.m. Mass**. There will be options for walkers and non-walkers. You can walk as little or as much as you like, and we'll have multiple rest stops. After the walk, we'll upload our total mileage to the *Development and Peace* website to help get us "around the Earth."
