Isaiah 53:10-11 Hebrews 4:14-16 Mark 10:35-45

SALVATION

God's work of salvation is the focus on this weekend's readings. From the prophecy of Isaiah to Jesus' assuming the human condition as told in Hebrews to the ransom paid by Jesus in Mark's Gospel, we can see God's design. There may be human failings and misunderstandings along the way. We may even move away from God, but it is always God who initiates our conversion, who leads us back.

Like James and John, we may let greed and power blur our vision of what Jesus wants us to see in God's dominion, but God tirelessly teaches and reminds us of what life there will be like. Jesus has paid our ransom to ensure that we will share in the reign of God.

It is not unusual to think of Jesus' ransom as a punishment that he endured. However, it may be more accurate, and more like Jesus to recognize that ransom as God's gift to us.
