

### **BE CAREFUL WHAT YOU ASK FOR**

It is interesting to compare the 'sons' of last week's Gospel – James and John, sons of Zebedee (thunder) – with the 'son' presented today: Bartimaeus, son of Timaeus (fear). In both Gospel passages, Jesus is approached with a request ("What do you want me to do for you?" Jesus asks both times). We should note that both requests are made in complete faith in Jesus and his power. But what a difference in the requests! Those called as disciples by Jesus himself ask for positions of glory. The beggar asks for pity and healing, in order that he might become a disciple.

Whenever we pray in faith to Christ, we would do well to ask ourselves whether we want to choose James and John or Bartimaeus as our role model. Do we ask for position, status, things that will raise us up in the estimation of others? Or do we ask to be healed of our illnesses and shortcomings, whatever their nature, in order to follow Christ, like Bartimaeus, as a more faithful disciple?
