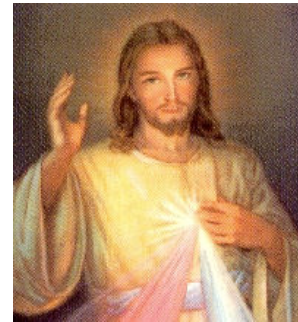

Old John, the evangelist, is mellow now. He could remember outrunning Peter to arrive at the tomb first, but he would not dream of running anywhere any more. From his old age and his clear vantage point, John offers mature reflection. His Gospel is the only one that gives the Church the heartening story of the doubting Thomas and puts in place our need for sustaining faith. In one fell swoop on an Easter eve, Jesus looks into the heart of his fallible followers and draws them to life. They follow, and we do, too.
