As you know, the obligation for coming to Mass has been lifted since March when Covid-19 became a serious issue here in Kansas. The obligation is still lifted. However, at our priestly gathering on August 16th the subject of reinstating the obligation of attending Mass was discussed. Clearly it will not be happening in the immediate future, but it is on the radar.

That being said, for those who have not been coming to Mass in person, I would encourage as many as possible to consider returning. While watching Mass at home is good, attending in person is better. In person you have the privilege of receiving the Eucharist, the source and summit of our faith. We also get to interact in a more intimate way (even with masks and/or social distancing) with our brothers and sisters in faith, the people of God or, as we know ourselves to be called, the Body of Christ. Clearly, there are many spiritual benefits to attending Mass in person, but I believe there are also mental, emotional and physical benefits. Now it is still true that if you are not feeling well, it is best if you remain home. If you are a person who is in the highly susceptible range, it is fine and perhaps even encouraged for you to stay at home. If you are taking care of a person who is highly susceptible, stay home. But I suspect there are many who could be attending Mass who simply haven't made that leap yet. Let me encourage you to start seriously considering taking that "leap of Faith".
