A Reflection on Today's Gospel...

The Parables of the Hidden Treasure and the Pearl Parable of the Net

Matthew 13: 44-52

Jesus' parable of the hidden treasure and parable of the pearl reveals that the Kingdom of Heaven is the greatest value to a person. "The kingdom of heaven is like a treasure buried in a field, which a person finds and hides again, and out of joy goes and sells all that he has and buys that field." Buying the entire field in order to have the treasure reflects, in a way, how God has redeemed the entire world through the sacrifice of his only Son so that everyone who believes in him might have eternal life.

The final parable of the net was a harsh departure from the joyful images preceding it. Jesus was teaching his disciples that the Kingdom of God includes a final judgement for all people of all time. It is like this: Fishermen (men who catch fish) put a net in the water. They catch all kinds of fish, good and bad. At last they pull the net to the shore, and separate the fish. They keep the good ones but they throw away the bad ones. Jesus says that it will be like that at the end of the age. \*Angels will separate the righteous people from the wicked people."

When Jesus had finished speaking about the Kingdom, he asked his disciples if they had understood. And, they had understood at least in part. Then Jesus goes on to speak about the scribe, instructed in the Kingdom of Heaven, bringing out of his treasure house things old and new. What Jesus is in effect saying is this: We come to Jesus Christ with some gift and with some ability. Jesus does not ask that we should give things up and abandon our gifts and talents, but to use them even more wonderfully. A scholar does not give up his scholarship when he becomes a Christian, rather he uses it for Christ. The sportsman need not give up his sport but play as a Christian would.

#### **Celebrate Mass - Staying Connected**

We will again gather at St. Andrew to celebrate Mass together as a community next Sunday, July 26th at 8 AM, 10 AM, and 12 Noon. Because we are still limited to 50 people (including ministers), we will again have a pre-registration system for members of our community to sign up online for a Mass. You will be sent and email with the link again on Monday by noon. Registration will be on a first come, first serve basis. For those who do not use a computer, you will need to call the parish office each week to be signed up from designated reserved seating.

#### If your plans change...

Please use the Sign-up Confirmation e-mail to cancel, change the quantity in your party, or go to another Mass time. Just click on Edit My Sign Up or Delete (Cancel). This should be done as soon as you know that your plans have changed, even if it is 30 minutes before Sunday Mass starts and you or a member of your party are not going to be able to attend Mass. This will allow someone else an opportunity to attend.

We will continue to stay in constant contact with you through emails to keep you informed of any changes or adjustments in restrictions, protocols, and procedures as we transition into this "new normal." If you are viewing this bulletin on the St. Andrew website, but you haven't been receiving emails from us, please contact the parish office.

### **Dispensation from the Obligation to Attend Sunday Mass**

Bishop Thomas has extended the **dispensation** for all Catholic faithful of the Diocese of Las Vegas and those Catholics visiting within the geographic boundaries of our Diocese **from** the obligation of attending Sunday Masses up to and including August 30, 2020.

He recognizes that many are eager to return to Mass in our churches, it remains important for those who are elderly and otherwise at risk to refrain from returning to public Liturgies until it is manifestly safe to do so. For all the faithful, especially those who are sick, at high risk of becoming sick, and their caregivers, the obligation to attend Sunday Mass is hereby dispensed.

#### At Home with the Word, 2021

It is hard to believe that summer is almost over. Before you know it, it will be the start of a new liturgical year and the four major liturgical seasons of Advent, Christmas Time, Lent, and Easter Time with the many weeks of Ordinary Time dispersed in between. We will also go from the Gospel Accounts of Matthew for Year A to Mark in Year B. This means that those who use *At Home with the Word* for their Sunday scripture readings, will need the book for 2021. This year due to COVID-19 and many of you using other resources for Sunday Scriptures and Scripture Insights, we will need to TAKE ORDERS for *At Home with the Word* and COLLECT payment in advance by either check or cash of \$8.00 for regular print and \$12.00 for large print. We would need to receive your book request and pre-payment no later than August 15, 2020. You can drop it in the mail or in the Sunday collection basket at church. #### **COVID-19 TESTING in BOULDER CITY**

Looking out for others

The COVID-19 testing will be held at the Boulder City Fire Department by appointment only on **Tuesdays from 8 AM to 11 AM through this month of July.** Boulder City paramedics and hospital nurses will do the nasal swab test. The nasal swab is to test for the active virus.



"We are doing what residents of Boulder City have always done: looking out for each other," said Boulder City Mayor Kiernan McManus in a written statement." **Testing is important as some people who have COVID-19 may not show symptoms, but can still spread this highly contagious virus. Help keep your family, friends, co-workers and those that provide service to us safe and healthy."** 

Patients must be able to provide a full name, address and contact information to get tested. No doctor's order is required, and results are back within one week. Those wanting a test must be a Boulder City resident.

To schedule a test, call (702) 293-9256 between 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.
