### **DECREE**

**Dispensation from the Obligation to Attend Mass Extension  
October 25, 2020 through November 29, 2020**

While I have granted permission to begin the reopening of public Masses, due to the ongoing gravity of the present moment and the restrictions being placed on us during the civil reopening plan, I hereby extend the dispensation for all Catholic faithful of the Diocese of Las Vegas and those Catholics visiting within the geographic boundaries of our Diocese, from the obligation of attending Sunday Masses up to and including November 29, 2020. While we recognize that many are eager to return to Mass in

our churches, it remains important for those who are elderly and otherwise at risk to refrain from returning to public Liturgies until it is manifestly safe to do so. For all the faithful, especially those who are sick, at high risk of becoming sick, and their caregivers, the obligation to attend Sunday Mass is hereby dispensed.

### Today's GOSPEL REFLECTION:

***Matthew 22: 34-40***

***The Greatest Commandment***

In today's gospel, the Pharisees gathered together and one of them, a scholar of the law asked Jesus: "Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?" (Matthew 22: 36). It is clear that they were trying to trick Jesus. However, Jesus answered by quoting the Old Testament and the *tradition* that the Pharisees respected so much. He said to them: "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. The second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself."

This brings to mind the opening number "*Tradition! Tradition!*" for the Broadway musical *Fiddler on the Roof*. As the curtain opens for the first act, the attention of the audience is drawn to the roof of a house on the stage. A violin begins a haunting tune and the shadow of a fiddler, violin tucked under his chin, is seen dancing on the roof. The story centers on Tevye, the father of five daughters, and his attempts to maintain his Jewish religious and cultural traditions as outside influences encroach upon the family's lives. He must cope both with the strong-willed actions of his three older daughters, who wish to marry for love – each one's choice of a husband moves further away from the customs of their Jewish faith and heritage – and with the edict of the Tsar that evicts the Jews from their village. Jesus also went to the *heart of the Pharisees' tradition and his own*. In Jewish writings these two commandments

summarized the whole of the law. Every Pharisee, every Jew—even Tevye dairy farmer in the village of Anatevaka—knew those words.

When Jesus mentioned the Great Commandment, he also said a second is like it: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." (Matthew 22:39). In fact, Jesus said that our love for one another will be the sign by which people will be able to tell that you are his disciples (John 13:35). Our love does not hinge on how that person thinks or, as we go through an election, on how he/she votes. Each person is a special creation of God—a bearer of God's image to love as God loves us. While each of us may disagree about some things, there are some things on which we can all agree as Catholic Christians. Our faith shapes everything about us, including our politics and not the other way around. We form our consciences through being open to truth, studying Scripture and Church teachings, and through prayer and trusting in the Lord.

#### **Pope Francis' "Civil Unions" Statement**

*Bishop Thomas has reflected below on Pope Francis' recent "Civil Unions" statement. One dictionary defines a civil union as: "a legally recognized union with rights similar to those of marriage, created originally for same-sex couples in jurisdictions where they were not legally allowed to marry."*

#### **Bishop Thomas' Reflection on Pope Francis' "Civil Unions" Statement**

Pope Francis' comments regarding civil unions were made in the context of the documentary interview called *Francesco* by filmmaker Evgeny Afineevsky.

In this documentary, the Pope expressed an openness to laws that recognize civil unions, including those of gay couples.

The Holy Father's remarks do not change the Catholic Church's consistent teachings that marriage is, as Jesus taught, "the union of man and woman as the Creator willed it..." ([\*Catechism of the Catholic Church, #1614 – see #1602-1620 on Marriage in God's Plan.\*](#))

Rather, the Pope's observations flow from the life stories of persons in a variety of domestic partnerships who have faced struggles and hardships in their daily lives over benefits that married couples often take for granted.

In the past these included issues like the ability to participate in employer sponsored health insurance programs, access to loved ones who are hospitalized, and survivor benefits.

The Holy Father has been consistent in his belief that “...marriage is a union between a man and women. You can’t change it just like that.” He wrote, “It’s the nature of things.”

The Pope’s recognition of “civil unions” is the first time that a Pope has acknowledged the possible benefits associated with these unions.

The Church equips its members to address political and social questions by helping them to develop a well-formed conscience. **Conscience is the voice of God** resounding in the human heart, revealing the truth to us and calling us to do what is good while shunning what is evil. **Conscience always requires** serious attempts to make **sound moral judgments based on the truths of our faith** (paragraph no. 17). **Catholics have a serious and lifelong obligation to form their consciences through being open to truth, studying Scripture and Church teachings**, as contained in the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*, examining facts and background information about various choices, and prayerful reflection (paragraph no. 18).

The bishops call attention to issues with significant moral dimensions that should be carefully considered. As described, some issues involve principles that can never be abandoned, such as the fundamental right to life and marriage as the union of one man and one woman. way to apply Catholic principles (paragraph no. 63). Catholics cannot ignore or simply dismiss the Church's guidance or policy directions that flow from these principles.

As Catholics, we are led to raise questions for political life other than those that concentrate on individual, material well-being. Rather, we focus on what protects or threatens the dignity of every human life (Paragraph no. 91). Catholic teaching challenges voters and candidates, citizens, and elected officials, to consider the moral and ethical dimensions of public policy issues (Paragraph no. 92). In light of ethical principles, the bishops offer policy goals that they hope will guide Catholics as they form their consciences and reflect on the moral dimensions of their public choices.

National Vocation Awareness Week, celebrated November 1-7, 2020 is an annual week-long celebration of the Catholic Church in the United States dedicated to promote vocations to the priesthood, diaconate and consecrated life, but also marriage and the single life through prayer and education, and to renew our prayers and support for those who are considering one of these particular vocations. National Vocation Awareness Week (NVAW) began in 1976 when the U. S. bishops designated the 28th Sunday of the year for NVAW. In 1997, this celebration was moved to coincide with the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, which falls on January 13 in 2013. Beginning in 2014, NVAW was moved to the first full week of November.
