### **Masks**

**Anyone who is fully vaccinated\* is no longer required to wear masks on Diocesan properties. The verification of vaccinations will be based solely on the honor system.**

\*The CDC has provided that: *“In general, people are considered fully vaccinated:*

- *2 weeks after their second dose in a 2-dose series, such as the Pfizer or Moderna vaccines*
- *2 weeks after a single-dose vaccine, such as Johnson & Johnson's Janssen vaccine.”*

**Out of consideration for the many people who remain medically vulnerable (including certain clergy and the elderly), the Diocesan Restoration Advisory Council encourages the continued wearing of masks. The wearing or not wearing a mask, is a personal decision that we all respect.**

**The Diocese is also encouraging the continuance of social distancing of **three (3) feet** between congregants that are not of the same household.**

**GOSPEL REFLECTION**  
Mark 5: 21-43

Then, in the midst of the crowd, there was that sick woman, and Jesus was aware. But how did Jesus, in the middle of so many people, realize that a woman had touched Him? And, indeed, He asked directly: “Who touched me?”. The disciples, in return, pointed out to Jesus: “You see the crowd pressing around you, and yet you say, ‘Who touched me?’” The question, is that Jesus not only understands the crowd, feels the crowd, but He hears the beating of each one of our hearts, of each one of us: He cares for all and for each one, always!

The same situation happens again when the ruler of the Synagogue approaches Jesus to tell Him about his gravely ill little daughter. And He leaves everything to tend to this one: Jesus in the great and in the small, always! Then, we can go on and see that He arrives at the house, He sees that tumult, those women who were called to mourn over the dead body, wailing, weeping. But Jesus says: “Don’t worry: she’s sleeping!”. And in response to these words, some even begin to scoff at Him. However, He stays quiet and with his patience he manages to bear this situation, to avoid responding to those who mock Him.

*The demands on Jesus were great, yet, he took the time to stop, talk and help others. So must we and when we cannot help, ask Jesus to intercede.*

**GOSPEL REFLECTION**  
Mark 6: 1-6

In this Gospel of Mark we hear about Jesus returning to His hometown of Nazareth after performing the magnificent miracles we have heard in recent weeks, including the calming of the storm and the raising of Jairus' daughter from the dead. Despite these powerful signs and the authoritative teaching Jesus conveyed in His hometown's synagogue, the people there still expressed disbelief. The main reason for their lack of faith was their close familiarity with Jesus. They could not fathom that the "carpenter, the son of Mary," whom they had seen grow up in their midst could be such an extraordinary prophet and even the Messiah. Jesus quoted the Old Testament to illustrate what He experienced: "A prophet is not without honor except in his native place and among his own kin and in his own house." This can be true of our own experiences too. Is it not most difficult to witness to our faith among those who are closest to us? This is often the case because emotions run high with family and close friends, especially if we disagree. Jesus Himself experienced the alienation of those closest to Him. If you are experiencing that too, just remember that Jesus can relate to your situation and provide strength and comfort to you.


