Masks

Anyone who is fully vaccinated* is no longer required to wear masks on Diocesan properties. The verification of vaccinations will be based solely on the honor system.

**The CDC has provided that: "In general, people are considered fully vaccinated:*

- 2 weeks after their second dose in a 2-dose series, such as the Pfizer or Moderna vaccines*
- 2 weeks after a single-dose vaccine, such as Johnson & Johnson's Janssen vaccine."*

Out of consideration for the many people who remain medically vulnerable (including certain clergy and the elderly), the Diocesan Restoration Advisory Council encourages the continued wearing of masks. The wearing or not wearing a mask, is a personal decision that we all respect.

The Diocese is also encouraging the continuance of social distancing of **three (3) feet between congregants that are not of the same household.**

GOSPEL REFLECTIONS

Sunday, July 11, 2021

Mark 6: 7-13

We often forget that God has also created us for a purpose and mission on earth that will build God's kingdom. The gospel reading shows that purpose in action as Jesus summons the twelve disciples and sends them out.

As a missionary church, Jesus also wants to send each of us out to accomplish the tasks only we are gifted to do. Though we're all given particular **charisms*** at baptism, it's only through our living relationship with God that we're able to say yes to the presence of God and respond to the Holy Spirit's call to our mission. Charisms are different from the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit or the twelve fruits of the Holy Spirit in that they are gifts we are meant to give away. As we grow closer to Christ and walk with him, grace is released and our gifts are manifested. We cultivate our gifts over the course of our lives as we deepen our relationship with God, the church, and church teaching.

When we truly use our charisms, we are exceptionally effective and fruitful because God is working through us to do more than we could by ourselves. The readings this Sunday call each of us to listen, discern, and heed the way God is calling us individually.

WHAT IS A CHARISM (SPIRITUAL GIFT)?

"Charism" is the Greek word used in the New Testament for "favor" or "gratuitous gift." Charisms, or spiritual gifts, are special abilities given to all Christians by the Holy Spirit to give them power both to represent Christ and to be a channel of God's goodness for people. Whether extraordinary or ordinary, all charisms ought to be exercised in the service of God. (*Catechism of the Catholic Church 2003*).

GOSPEL REFLECTION

Sunday, July 18, 2021

Mark 6: 30-34

Compassion is a key word in this Gospel.

Compassion is written in Christ's heart; it is forever written in the heart of God.

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Today's Gospel passage (Mk 6:30-34) tells us that after their first mission, the Apostles returned to Jesus and told him "All that they had done and taught." (v. 30). After the experience of the mission, which was undoubtedly thrilling but also arduous, they needed to rest. And understanding this well, Jesus wished to give them some relief and said to them, "Come away by yourselves to a deserted place, and rest for a while" (v. 31). But Jesus' intention could not be fulfilled this time because the crowd, guessing the location of the lonely place where he would take the disciples by boat, ran there and got there ahead of them.

The same can happen today. At times we are not able to complete our projects because something urgent and unexpected occurs, disrupting our plans and this requires flexibility and being available to the needs of others.

In these situations, we are called to imitate what Jesus did: "When he disembarked and saw the vast crowd, his heart was moved with pity (*or compassion*) for them, for they were like sheep without a shepherd; and he began to teach them many things" (v. 34). With this brief sentence, the Evangelist offers us a flash of singular intensity, taking a snapshot of the eyes of the divine Master and his teaching. Let us observe the three verbs in this frame: to see, to have *compassion*, to teach. We can call them the Shepherd's verbs. The gaze of Jesus is not a neutral one — or worse, a cold and detached one because Jesus always looks with the eyes of the heart. And his heart is so tender and filled with compassion, that he is able to understand even the most hidden needs of people. Moreover, his compassion does not simply suggest an emotional response toward people in situations of distress. It is much more. It is God's attitude and predisposition toward mankind and its history. Jesus appears as the fulfilment of God's concern and care for his people.

Because Jesus was moved when he saw all those people in need of guidance and help, we would now expect him to perform some miracles. Instead, he began teaching them many things. This is the first bread that the Messiah offers to the starving and lost crowd; the bread of the Word. We all need the Word of truth to guide and illuminate our way. Without the truth which is Christ himself, it is not possible to find the right direction in life. When we distance ourselves from Jesus and his love, we become lost, and life is transformed into disappointment and dissatisfaction. With Jesus by our side, we can proceed with confidence and overcome all trials, advancing in love toward God and neighbor Jesus gave himself for others, thus becoming an example of love and service for each of us.
