MASS REGISTRATION - Mass registrations have been discontinued. Parishioners will no longer need to register on-line to attend Sunday Mass.

Spring Retreat - May 16 – 23 Praying in Color
Think art prayer meets a busy person retreat. We will engage in prayer/play with the Holy Spirit as we use simple art techniques to explore how creativity connects us to the Divine Will. This retreat is not about performance, skill, talent, or output. It is about using commonly available materials to play in prayer with the Creator who calls us to join in Co-Creating throughout our temporal lives.

The process is as much the prayer as any final product. However, due to the nature of the materials used, this retreat needs to take place over an extended period to allow time for pieces to dry - hence the busy person retreat aspect.

The outline of the retreat is as follows:

Sunday, May 16, 2:00-5:00 pm
This will be the retreat kick-off. We will pray together and there will be an introduction to the materials and techniques to be used during the week.

Monday, May 17, 7:00 pm
Tuesday, May 18, 7:00 pm
Wednesday, May 19, 7:00 pm

These evenings we will offer **optional** technique classes offered by talented parishioners including lettering/prayer journaling, card making, and beaded rosary making. These sessions will require pre-registration and additional material fees.

Sunday, May 23, 3:00-5:00 pm
This concluding session will include the opportunity to reflect upon and share your experience (and your art, if you choose) and to close our retreat in prayer.

What happens the rest of the week?
That is up to you: to allow time for playing and praying the parish hall will be open from 8 am-10 pm Monday-Saturday that week so whenever you can stop by to create you are invited to do so!

Who is this retreat for and how much does it cost?
This retreat is open to any parishioner including high school and college students. Unfortunately, this retreat is not appropriate for younger students. Also, because of space limitations, registration preferences will be given to UPNC parishioners over others from outside our community. Registration will be limited to 20 participants. Cost for the basic retreat is \$10 for materials and snacks. Optional evening classes will have an additional cost based on materials needed.
