Programs/Activities

*K-12 Religious Education had about 100 students register this year. Classes are going well overall. New teachers are comfortable in their role; the setting at St Joe campus is working out very well; there is participation in the parent group. There are 25 7/8 graders. The high school youth meet every other week from 6:15-7:45. Parents take turns assisting but the class has become more student led.

*Confirmation will take place on Saturday October 27th 11 am at Our Lady of Perpetual Help in NA. The liturgy is planned. There are students from St John Paul II (26), OLPH, St Mary's New Albany, St Mary's Navillton, Holy Family and Starlight. It will be a bilingual celebration.

October will be our month for Confirmation from here forward. You must be out of the 8th grade to prepare for this sacrament.

*RCIA has started out well. There is a great group of program facilitators! There are 7-10 people participating with 2 others celebrating their Confirmation at the Easter vigil.

*Adult Faith Formation is meeting soon. There is the 24 week study on the bible-Matthew beginning soon along with the Bible and the Virgin Mary meeting once a month.

*Marriage Enrichment – There are no new updates. Kristina will make contact with the young couple who was recommended by the Herbsts.

*Nursery/CLOW - 9:30 and 11:15 masses -> We have great volunteers overall. The time where we struggle for volunteers is the nursery at 11:15. CLOW is great at both campuses! Anne will call volunteers for the nursery. Committee also discussed 5th Sunday volunteers.

* Formed.org - 172 parishioners to date. Members can share items of interest on other social media sites. Kristina will check on specifics to share in the bulletin.

*SPREAD – The religious ed gathering for adults with disabilities is struggling for participation. The Leads cancelled the Sept activity. There is a meeting October 25. Criterion had an article on the topic and Dolores was interviewed. Commission had a discussion on this.

*Catechetical Sunday event was not well attended but was a really nice event for those that did attend. They were touched by the celebration. We will continue this event for next year to show our

appreciation to the catechists in our church family! Ideas: involve parents and kids in thanking their catechists...start earlier (late August) and explain who/what a catechist is...what they do... importance etc. - Do this in the bulletin or maybe even in announcements.

*Advent activities -> Advent begins December 2. Reading Rack materials are ordered and organized by Dolores Snyder

*December 1st is the annual Breakfast with Santa. We will participate again this year with a craft and take homes. This year we decided on Advent wreath kits, Advent calendar/poster. Kristina will order and Carolyn, Ann and Cheryl will help Kristina that day.

Faith Formation Members – Our membership is set at this time. A roster was created and checked for completeness and accuracy.

A Parish Life Commission meeting was held at 5:00 PM on Tuesday, October 2, 2018, in the Upstairs Conference Room of the Parish Office Building at the St. Joe Hill Campus in Sellersburg, Indiana.

The following members of the Parish Life Commission were present: Fr. Tom Clegg, Rosella Klein, Betty J. Popp and Linda Hunter.

Fr. Tom Clegg, the Parish Life Commission's Pastoral Team Liaison, led the meeting. Linda Hunter recorded the minutes.

Father Tom distributed and read The First Fifteen for Sunday, October 7, 2018 (Mark 10: 2-16). After discussion, the Glory Be prayer was prayed.

Fr. Tom distributed a meeting agenda and copies of the September 4, 2018 minutes. There being no changes to the September 4, 2018 minutes, the minutes were approved.

The first item of business was the Veterans Day program scheduled for November 11, 2018. Betty Popp reported that she has been working with the St. John Paul II Catholic School concerning the Veterans Day Program. The program will be similar to last year's in that the kindergarten through 4th grade children will present the program. There will be flyers as in the past, and an announcement will be published in the church bulletin 3 or 4 times. The school principal sends information home with the school children concerning the Veterans Day Program. Attendance at previous programs has been 32 veterans in year 1, 39 veterans in year 2, and 26 veterans in year 3.

The next item of business concerned the Turkey Shoot. It was suggested that the worker's list be reviewed and revised.

Recruiting of new Parish Life Commission members was discussed. Fr. Tom has sent emails to those who expressed interest in service on committees. It was suggested that Fr. Tom send an e-mail about opportunities for service on the Parish Life Commission.

The next item of discussion was welcoming new parishioners. Betty Popp described welcoming events done at other parishes including a small group "pitch in with a priest". Other suggestions were welcome letters to new parishioners, a welcome committee visit with a directory and small gift, a progressive pitch in meal, a wine and cheese event, and house blessings in neighborhoods followed by a meal.

Men Rise Up – Keith reported that 52 men signed up to participate in the program. The parish ended up paying for 41. Keith has been having discussions with the men over coffee at Crickets on Tuesday mornings from 6:30-8. 5 support groups have branched off from this. Niall Thompson has also started a group for the younger adults. Keith has also encouraged the men who went through Rise to attend the E6 Conference in February.

Prayer Partners – Katie reported that Gene Deely has expressed an interest in becoming a Prayer Partner. He is having some back issues right now and plans to start after he works all that stuff out. Fr. Tom has requested that a small group of Prayer Partners pray before the Town Board Meeting that happens twice a month.

Retreat – Jesse is going to call Phyllis and Esther to get a final word on what needs to be done for October 21.

Family Statue – It was decided to start distributing the box on the First Sunday of Advent. Tina plans on making covers for the boxes if they are ever not in use.
