### ■ NEW YEAR RESOLUTION: GOD'S PEACE IN YOUR HEART

Today is New Year's Day and there is always a feeling of hope and new life in the air. Some people overcome themselves with resolutions to change parts of their lives, to become better persons in some part of their lives.

What is important is to take a wiser and more intentional approach, because fortified eggnog wears off, and we can be left with our old selves. I would suggest that each of us focus on Peace: personal peace in all our relationships, personal peace within ourselves. We cannot coast into peace. We can find it only by discovering the presence that is ourself, and connecting to the presence of God, that enables us to connect to one another.

May the New year begin in peace and peacefully run its course. May we work at living a peaceful life with everyone around us. May we promote peaceful relationships between members of our families.

In our families, it all comes down to living together and working for each other's happiness – the best of friendship and teamwork.

**A word to parents:** You are models for your children. They will take on and imitate your goodness or your dysfunctions. Strive to be and to act the very best model. If not, you will end up in a muddle.

**A word to children:** Your parents are working very hard so that you can have a very good life. You can express your appreciation when asked to help around the home. You can also become more thoughtful and respectful toward one another. That cuts down on a lot of noise inside the home. Is it that important to get one's way? There should be only one way – to be together, to be there for each other. Love flows from the heart, never from being selfish or wanting only for oneself.

Do you want peace in your home and family life? Then you have to make peace happen.



### ■ POPE FRANCIS WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR PEACE

Pope Francis in his message for the 50<sup>th</sup> World of Peace writes: "I wish peace to every man, woman, and child, and I pray that the image and likeness of God in each person will enable us to acknowledge one another as sacred gifts endowed with immense dignity."

In the first World Day of Peace, Pope Francis recalls Pope Paul VI writing: "Peace is the only true direction of human progress – and not the tensions caused by ambitions, nationalisms, not conquests by violence, nor repressions which serve as mainstay for false civil order."

### ■ THE DOMESTIC ROOTS OF A POLITICS OF NON-VIOLENCE

Pope Francis refers to and quotes from his exhortation, "The Joy of Love" – "The Family is the indispensable crucible in which spouses, parents and children, brothers and sisters learn to communicate and to show concern for one another, and in which friction and even conflicts have to be resolved, not by force, but by dialogue, respect, concern for the good of the other, mercy and forgiveness."

We have just completed a Holy Year of Mercy, studying, reflecting and witnessing the God of Mercy breaking open human hearts, which in turn have become more merciful. This change does not just happen. "Each one of us needs to look deeply within and to allow God's mercy to enter there."

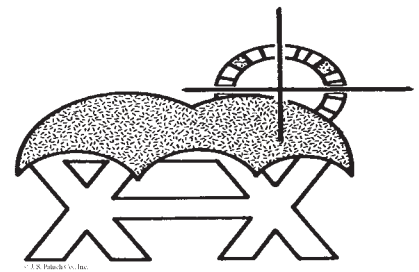
It was St. Therese of Lisieux, called the Little Flower, who invited and reminded people "to practice the little way of love, not to miss out on a kind word, a smile or any small gesture which sows peace and friendship."

### ■ "PRIMERO DIOS," PUT GOD FIRST

When I go to El Salvador each year to close the scholastic "Instituto" named after me, I begin to hear a very deep-hearted and faith-inspired expression: "Primero Dios." Most Latin American countries have a similar expression. "Primero Dios" can be translated: "God takes first place" or "If God wishes" or "It's up to God."

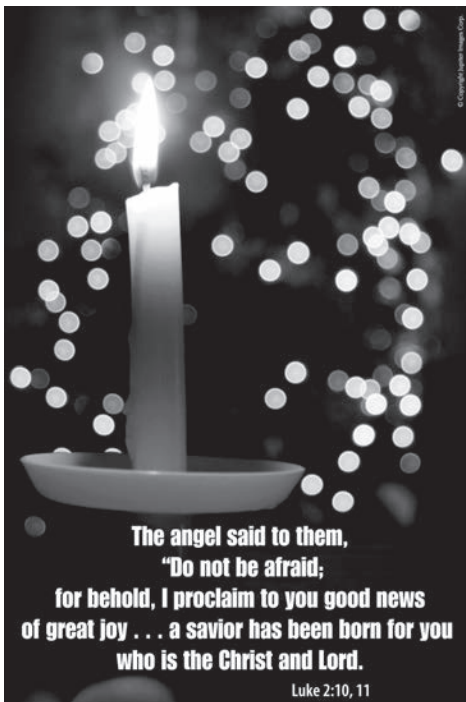
The expression is more than just a "Hello, goodbye or good luck." It is a genuine, heartfelt expression of humility and gratitude. "Will I see you tomorrow?" Primero Dios. "I will pray that you will feel better," Primero Dios. "I will see you soon," Primero Dios. "I hope you get the job," Primero Dios. "I hope that you do well in that test," Primero Dios. It is really a prayer.

Although a cultural expression, it expresses a total dependence on God, a subtle humility and a kind gentleness toward all. Could we all put that expression into our hearts and our vocabulary? Primero Dios!

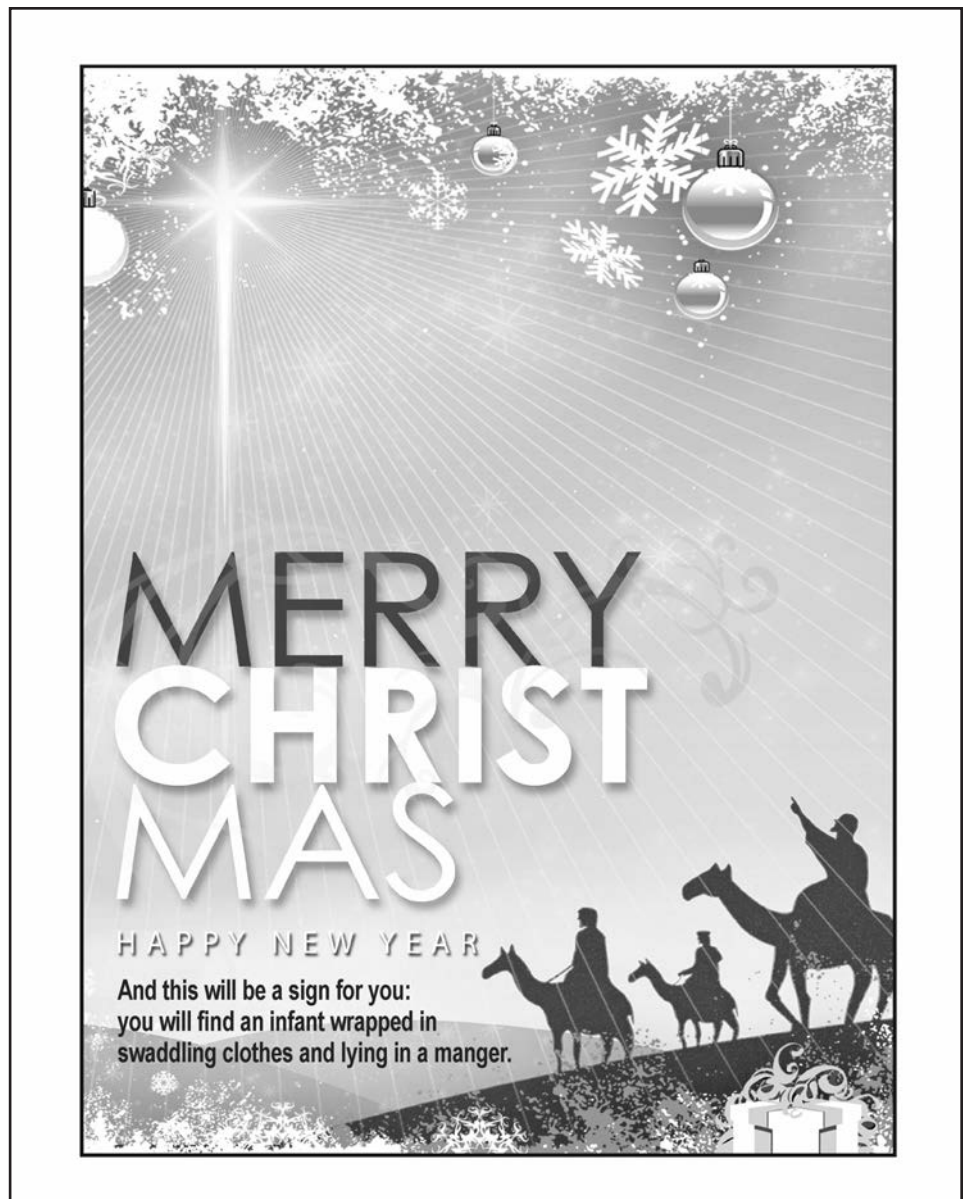

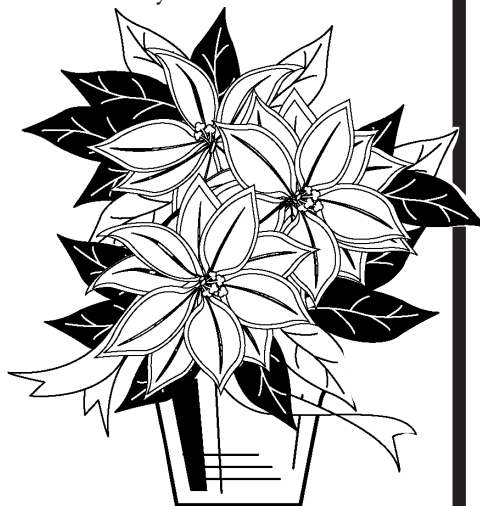

En nuestras familias, viviendo juntos y trabajando por la felicidad de cada uno de los miembros de la familia – es lo mejor de la amistad y el trabajo en equipo.

**Una palabra a los padres:** Ustedes son modelos para sus hijos. Ellos toman e imitan su bondad o su disfunción. Trate de ser y esfuércese por ser el mejor modelo para ellos o usted terminara confundido.

**Una palabra a los niños:** sus padres están trabajando muy duro para que tengan una muy buena vida. Ustedes pueden expresar su aprecio y agradecimiento ayudando en los trabajos de la casa. También pueden ser más reflexivos y respetuosos el uno con el otro. Esto reduce mucho el ruido dentro del hogar. ¿Es importante tener una manera? Sólo debe haber una manera-- estar juntos, estar el uno para el otro. El amor fluye desde el corazón, nunca ser egoístas o desear solamente para uno mismo.

¿Quieren paz en su hogar y en su vida familiar? Entonces tienen que hacer que suceda la paz.

## ■ PAPA FRANCISCO. JORNADA MUNDIAL DE ORACIÓN POR LA PAZ.

El Papa Francisco en su mensaje para la 50 Jornada Mundial de la Paz escribe: “deseo la paz a cada hombre, mujer y niño, a la vez que rezó para que la imagen y semejanza de Dios en cada persona nos permita reconocernos unos a otros como dones sagrados dotados con inmensa dignidad.”

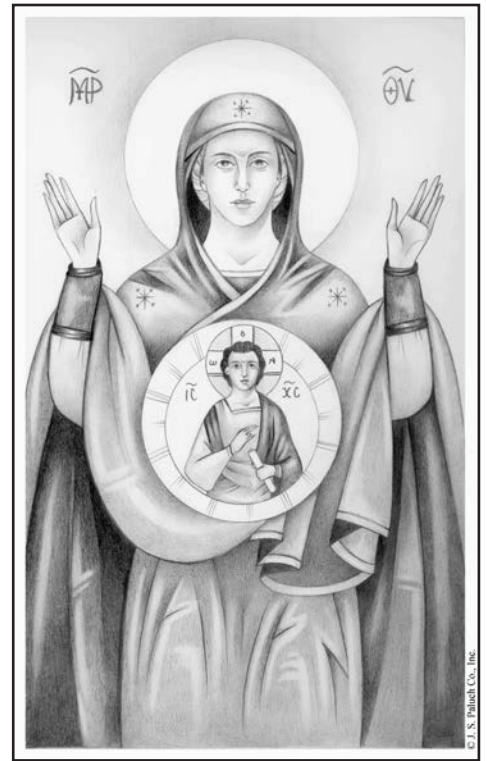
En el primer Día de la Jornada Mundial de la Paz, el Papa Francisco recuerda el escrito del Papa Pablo VI: “La paz es la línea única y verdadera del progreso humano – y no las tensiones de nacionalismos ambiciosos, ni las conquistas violentas, ni las represiones portadoras de un falso orden civil”.

## ■ LAS RAÍCES NACIONALES DE LA POLÍTICA DE LA NO VIOLENCIA

El Papa Francisco se refiere y cita partes de su exhortación, “La Alegría del Amor” – “la familia es indispensable, crisol en que cónyuges, padres y niños, hermanos y hermanas aprenden a comunicarse y a mostrar preocupación unos por otros, y en que la fricción y los conflictos incluso tienen que resolverse, no por fuerza, sino por el diálogo, respeto, preocupación por el bien del otro, misericordia y perdón.”

Sólo hemos completado el Año Santo de Misericordia, estudiando, reflexionando y siendo testigos de la Misericordia de Dios, que abre los corazones afligidos, los cuales se han vuelto más misericordiosos. Este cambio no sucede solo. “Cada uno de nosotros necesitamos mirar profundamente dentro de nosotros mismos y permitir que la misericordia de Dios entre allí”.

Fue Santa Teresa de Lisieux, llamada la Pequeña Flor, quien invitó y recordó a la gente “practicar pequeños gestos de amor, decir una palabra amable, una sonrisa o cualquier pequeño gesto que siembre paz y amistad.”



## ■ “PRIMERO DIOS”

Cuando voy al Salvador cada año a la clausura del año escolar del “Instituto” que lleva mi nombre, empiezo a oír una expresión muy profunda de corazón e inspirada en la fe: “Primero Dios.” La mayoría de los países latinoamericanos tiene una expresión similar. “Primero Dios” se puede traducir como: “Dios tiene el primer lugar” o “Si Dios quiere” o “Incumbe a Dios.”

La expresión es más que un “Hola, adiós o buena suerte.” Es una expresión genuina, sentida, llena de humildad y gratitud. “Lo veo mañana,” Primero Dios. “Ruego para que se sienta mejor,” Primero Dios. “Le veré pronto,” Primero Dios. “Espero que obtenga el trabajo,” Primero Dios. “Deseo que le vaya bien en el examen,” Primero Dios. Esta es realmente una oración.

Al mismo tiempo que es una expresión cultural, expresa una dependencia total de Dios, una humildad sutil y una dulzura amable hacia todos. ¿Todos podríamos poner la expresión en nuestros corazones y en nuestro vocabulario? ¡Primero Dios!



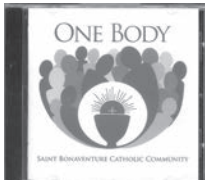
