HOW GREAT IS YOUR FAITH?

The evangelist Matthew invites us to reflect about faith. A Canaanite woman called out to Jesus: ***“Have pity on me, Lord, Son of David! My daughter is tormented by a demon.”*** The woman was worried and desperate, seeing her daughter tormented by a demon. She was in pain because of the condition of her daughter. It is true that a mother suffers when she sees her sons and daughters in pain. It affects the parents, whom they go to seek for healing. For this reason, the Canaanite woman approached Jesus, calling out to have pity that her daughter was tormented by a demon. We do not know how long her daughter had been tormented by a demon. What she knew was that Jesus could heal her and no matter what, she would go to Him to plead for aid.

The Canaanite woman was going through a related crisis because her daughter was being tormented by a demon. Jesus ignored her, but she continued to shout, persisting in her request that her daughter be healed. However, her faith overcame these obstacles. The Canaanite woman called out to Jesus to have pity on her, with faith. Jesus did not speak at first, as the disciples were annoyed by the insistence of the woman. She was following them; she believed that Jesus had the power to cure her daughter. Faith brought her closer to Jesus in this time of trial. The Canaanite woman called out to Jesus for faith, prostrated herself and cried out to him with faith. At the beginning, Jesus ignored her. He did not pay attention to the woman. We can hardly see the compassionate Jesus when he answered the

Canaanite woman ***“It is not right to take the food of the children and throw it to the dogs.”*** She said, ***“Please, Lord, for even the dogs eat the scraps that fall from the table of their masters.”*** She did not belong to the family of Israel. She knew it, but she had strong faith because these words did not discourage her. Jesus challenged her faith with these strong words, but she did not give up her faith. She was sure that Jesus could heal her. She keeps asking Jesus with faith. She could have given up and feel bad, but she did not doubt Jesus’ power.

Jesus exalts the faith of the Canaanite woman. Jesus said ***“O woman, great is your faith! Let it be done for you as you wish.”*** Jesus was astonished to see the woman’s faith; astonished that she did not ask any more questions. The faith of the woman so amazed Jesus that he said: ***“Let it be done for you as wish.”*** The Canaanite woman’s heart rejoiced with happiness that Jesus had listened to her petition and did not disappoint her. The obstacles were not a problem for her, because she wanted her daughter to receive the healing. She did not give up. She remained strong in her request to Jesus. Now the Canaanite woman could go home happy and with peace in her heart, happy to see her daughter released from the torment of the demon. Now her daughter could live happily with her family. The faith of the Canaanite woman was the channel to receive the healing of her daughter.

Jesus says to the Canaanite woman: ***“How great is your faith?”***

Now, let us reflect about our faith. Am I ready to demonstrate my faith? What would I do if Jesus answered my request just as he did with the Canaanite woman? Am I going to give up? The Canaanite woman becomes a great example of faith. She was a pagan woman and she was not from Israel. But she had faith that Jesus could cast out the demon from her daughter. She kept asking Jesus with faith. We will encounter obstacles that can discourage our faith, but do not give up because at the end Jesus will say ***“Let it be done for you as you wish.”*** If your prayers are not answered yet, do not give up because Jesus wants to see how great your faith is.

**REGISTRATION FOR RELIGIOUS
EDUCATION CLASSES**

St. Bonaventure's religious education classes will begin the week of September 24. Our faith formation programs begin with children as young as age 4 and kindergarten and continue through high school.

We offer a Sunday morning program for Pre-School age 4 and kindergarten-age children that meets during the 9am Mass. This program is designed to share stories from the Bible and to engage the youngest of our community to grow in their faith, with interactive activities.

We also offer classes after school during the week for students who are in the 1st through 5th grade. Each grade builds on the child's faith journey with Jesus. This includes preparation for the Sacraments of our faith. We will share the weekly Gospel with students to increase their awareness of Jesus' life and teachings and will talk about the foundations of our Catholic faith, how we live it and how we build that faith to become who Jesus wants us to be.

We will meet your child wherever they are in their Sacramental faith journey with class offerings for Baptism, First Communion, and Reconciliation. We also have Sacramental Preparation classes for First Communion that are taught in Spanish.

Registration for Faith Formation Classes will be held on Saturday, August 26, Sunday, August 27 and Sunday, September 10 from 9AM to 6PM in Classroom A-1. We will be available to answer any questions you have and assist you with registering your child for the appropriate class. You will also be able to register in the church office after August 27. If your child has been in our Faith Formation program last year, you will receive a packet of materials in the mail in mid-August. In mid-August, there will also be registration forms in the church foyer, in the church office and on our website at www.stbonaventure.net. Just click on the link for Faith Formation Registration.

IMMIGRATION MYTHS DEBUNKED

Myth #4: They take American jobs

The American economy needs immigrant workers. The belief that immigrants take jobs that can otherwise be filled by hard-working Americans has been disputed by an overwhelming number of economic research studies and data. Removing the approximately 8 million unauthorized workers in the US would not automatically create 8 million job openings for unemployed Americans, said Daniel Griswold, Director of the Cato Institute's Center for Trade Policy Studies in his 2011 testimony before the House Judiciary Sub-Committee on Immigration Policy & Enforcement.

The reason, according to the US Chamber of Commerce, is two-fold. For one, removing millions of undocumented workers from the economy would also remove millions of entrepreneurs, consumers and taxpayers. The economy would actually lose jobs. Second, native-born workers and immigrant workers tend to possess different skills that complement one another.

According to Griswold, immigrants, regardless of status, fill the growing gap between expanding low-skilled jobs and the shrinking pool of native-born Americans who are willing to take such jobs. By facilitating the growth of such sectors as retail, agriculture, landscaping, hotels, and restaurants, low-skilled immigrants have enabled those sectors to expand, attract investment, and create middle-class jobs in management, design and engineering, bookkeeping, marketing and other areas that employ US citizens.

In support of fixing the system, America's unions have stated: "For far too long, our broken immigration system has allowed employers to drive down wages and working conditions in our country," the AFL-CIO says on its website. "The brunt of the impact has been born by immigrant workers, who face the highest rates of wage theft, sexual harassment and death and injury on the job."

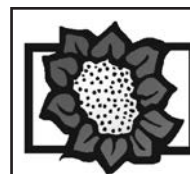

ANNIVERSARY

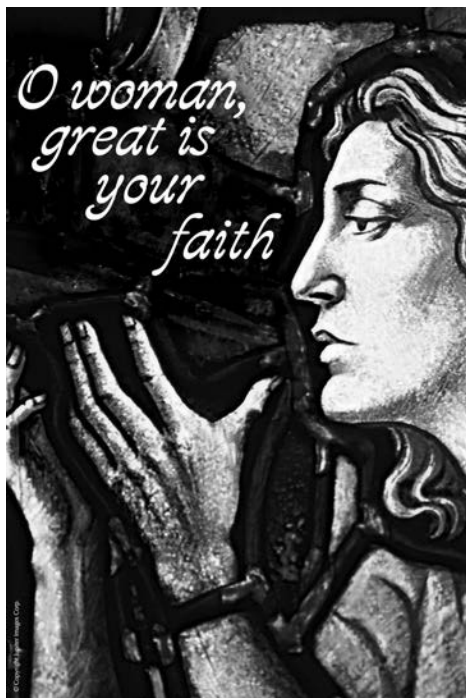

REFLEXION DEL PADRE OSCAR ROJAS



QUE TAN GRANDE ES TU FE

El evangelista nos invita a reflexionar sobre la fe. Una mujer cananea le salió al encuentro a Jesús y se puso a gritarle **“Señor, hijo de David, ten compasión de mí. Mi hija está terriblemente atormentada por un demonio.”** La mujer estaba preocupada y desesperada al ver a su hija atormentada por un demonio. Sin embargo, esta mujer pagana siente el dolor de su hija al ver la condición en la que se encuentra. Una madre sufre cuando ve sus hijos e hijas sufriendo por un dolor. Verdaderamente los problemas y dificultades que sufren los hijos afectan también a los padres porque ellos siempre desean que los hijos vivan felices. Por esta razón la mujer cananea sale al encuentro de Jesús porque su hija estaba horriblemente atormentada por un demonio. No sabemos cuánto tiempo su hija habría estado sufriendo el tormento del demonio. La mujer cananea era conocida por idolatra y hechicera y muchas otras cosas paganas, pero que amaba a su hija. Sin embargo, esta crisis familiar llevo a la mujer acercarse a Jesús y decirle, **¡Ten compasión de mí, Señor, Hijo de David!** Ella no podía pedirle más a Jesús porque no era judía. respuesta fuerte, pero ella sabía que no era de Israel, pero su fe era fuerte que la respuesta de Jesús no la decepciono. Jesús quería ver que tan fuerte era su fe que ella continuó pidiendo la curación para su hija con fe. Ella estaba segura de que Jesús podía sanar su hija y por esa razón continúa pidiendo con fe. Es razonable que la mujer se hubiera sentido mal al escuchar la respuesta de Jesús, pero eso no hizo cambiar su fe y dudar de la misericordia de Jesús.

La mujer cananea respondió a Jesús: **“Es cierto, Señor; pero también los perritos se comen las migajas que caen de la mesa de sus amos”.** Jesús exalto la fe de la mujer cananea: **“Mujer, ¡qué grande es tu fe! Que se cumpla lo que deseas”.** Jesús se quedó asombrado al escuchar las palabras de la mujer cananea porque expresaban su fe que él podía curar su hija. Jesús vio la seguridad que tenía en su fe que Jesús le dice que se cumpla lo que deseas y desde esa hora la hija se curó. Sin duda la mujer cananea se sintió feliz y en paz de que Jesús escucho su petición y su fe no la decepcionó. El hecho de no ser judía y ser cananea no fue obstáculo para que su hija recibiera la curación de Jesús. La mujer nunca se dio por vencida. Siempre permaneció firme en gritarle al Señor ten misericordia de mí. Después de que Jesús le concedió la curación a su hija, ya puede regresar a su casa feliz y en paz que su hija fue liberada del tormento del demonio. Hoy su hija puede vivir en paz y feliz con su familia. Verdaderamente, La fe de la mujer cananea fue el canal para que su hija recibiera la curación.

Jesús le dice a la mujer Cananea, mujer, ¡qué grande es tu fe! Hoy reflexionemos que grande es nuestra fe como bautizados en Cristo. ¿Estoy preparado para demostrar mi fe? ¿Qué haría si Jesús respondiera de la misma manera que le respondió a la mujer cananea? ¿Dejaré de orar al Señor? Hoy la mujer cananea se convierte un gran ejemplo de fe. Era una mujer pagana que no era de Israel, pero su fe era grande en Jesús que persevero pidiéndole ayuda al Señor. Hermanos y hermanas en nuestra vida encontraremos obstáculos que nos van a desalentar, perseveremos que al final Jesús nos dirá, **“que se cumpla como lo deseas.”** Si nuestras oraciones todavía no han sido escuchadas, continuemos orando que Jesús quiere ver que tan grande es nuestra fe.
