



THOUGHTS FROM DEACON BILL GALL



"Ten were cleansed, were they not? Where are the other nine?" —(Luke 17: 17-18)

Sometime ago, I remember reading an article in a publication called "Proclaim" which was entitled, "The Gratitude Gap." In the article, the author reminded us that "gratitude is a quality that is in short supply these days." Many people fail to be thankful for the many good gifts they receive each day. Between God's gifts and their response lies a gratitude gap. Just what is this gratitude gap?

The article went on to express "a society that feels entitled to what it receives does not adequately express gratitude." When we feel entitled to health, food, shelter, clothing, money and work, we don't pause to thank God for being the source of what we need for life. Instead of being deeply grateful for what we have, we complain that we do not have more." The gratitude gap is an empty expanse of no thanks.

The Gospel story today from Luke is a great example of ingratitude. We're told that while Jesus was passing through Samaria and Galilee on his way to Jerusalem, he was greeted by ten lepers; nine Jews and one Samaritan. From a distance, they cried out to him, "Jesus, Master! Have pity on us!" Jesus tells them to go and show themselves to the priests in accordance with the law and, as they were going, they were cured.

Luke then tells us that one of the lepers, a Samaritan, a foreigner, returns, falls at Jesus' feet and Jesus says to him, "Stand up and go, your faith has saved you." Not only is the leper healed but he is granted salvation for his faith in Jesus.

So, what does it mean for us today? In her book, "Attitudes of Gratitude," author M. J. Ryan, tells us "gratitude is a simple profound practice that can change your life. Research has confirmed its many emotional and physical benefits. Taking time to notice and reflect upon good things opens our hearts, creates happiness, and restores us to a natural place where we notice what's right instead of what's wrong."

She suggests a few ways to cultivate an attitude of gratitude:

- Write it down. Keep a gratitude journal.
- Talk about it. Share what you are thankful for.
- Express it. Find that person who made a difference in your life.
- Seek it. Get around people with that characteristic.

Finally, from that same article in "Proclaim," "Life is the greatest and most fundamental gift that is given to us by God, and it is one for which we should always be thankful. The gratitude gap will grow smaller as we realize how fortunate we are. This does not mean we will not encounter illness, hardship and failure...but as people who stop to give thanks, as the one leper did, we will find ourselves better able to make the most of the life that God has given us."

May Jesus bless each and every one of you.

PENSAMIENTOS DEL DÍACONO BILL GALL



"Diez fueron limpiados, ¿verdad? ¿Dónde están los otros nueve?" —(Lucas 17: 17-18)

Hace algún tiempo, recuerdo haber leído un artículo en una publicación llamada "Proclamación", titulado "El vacío de Gratitud". En el artículo, el autor nos recordó que "la gratitud es una cualidad que es escasa en estos días". Muchas personas no agradecen los muchos buenos regalos que reciben cada día. Entre los dones de Dios y su respuesta hay una brecha de gratitud. ¿Qué es este vacío de gratitud?

El artículo continuó expresando "una sociedad que se siente con derecho a lo que recibe no expresa adecuadamente su gratitud. Cuando nos sentimos con derecho a la salud, la alimentación, la vivienda, la ropa, el dinero y el trabajo, no nos detenemos para agradecer a Dios por ser la fuente de lo que necesitamos para la vida. En lugar de estar profundamente agradecidos por lo que tenemos, nos quejamos de que no tenemos lo suficiente." El vacío de gratitud es una extensión vacía de no gracias.

La historia del Evangelio hoy de Lucas es un gran ejemplo de ingratitud. Se nos dice que mientras Jesús pasaba por Samaria y Galilea camino a Jerusalén, es recibido por diez leprosos; nueve judíos y un samaritano. Desde la distancia, le gritan: "¡Jesús, Maestro! ¡Ten piedad de nosotros!" Jesús les dice que vayan y se muestren a los sacerdotes de acuerdo con la ley, y mientras iban, fueron curados.

Lucas, luego nos dice que uno de los leprosos, un samaritano, un extranjero, regresa, cae a los pies de Jesús y Jesús le dice:

Entonces, ¿qué significa para nosotros hoy? En su libro, "Actitudes de Gratitud", la autora M. J. Ryan, nos dice que "la gratitud es una práctica simple y profunda que puede cambiar tu vida. La investigación ha confirmado sus muchos beneficios emocionales y físicos. Tomar tiempo para notar y reflexionar sobre las cosas buenas abre nuestros corazones, crea felicidad y nos restaura a un lugar natural donde notamos lo que está bien en lugar de lo que está mal."

Ella sugiere algunas formas de cultivar una actitud de gratitud.

- Escríbelo. Mantenga un diario de agradecimiento.
- Hable al respecto. Comparte lo que estás agradecido.
- Exprésalo. Encuentra a esa persona que marcó la diferencia en tu vida.
- Buscarlo. Moverse con personas con esa característica.

Finalmente, de ese mismo artículo en "Proclama", "La vida es el regalo más grande y fundamental que Dios nos da, y es uno por el cual siempre debemos estar agradecidos. El vacío de gratitud se reducirá a medida que nos demos cuenta de lo afortunados que somos. Esto no significa que no tendremos enfermedades, dificultades ni fracasos ... pero como personas que se detienen a dar gracias, como lo hizo el leproso, nos encontraremos en mejores condiciones para aprovechar al máximo la vida que Dios nos ha dado."
