## THOUGHTS FROM FR. OSCAR ROJAS

### Christ The King Governs With Love



We have come to the end of Ordinary Time with the Solemnity of Christ the King. This brings the liturgical year to a close. Today, we celebrate our Sovereign King. Next Sunday, we will begin the season of Advent and the time of preparation for the great feast of the Nativity of

Our Lord.

Christ the King is known as Christ the giver, the governor and redeemer. The kingdom of Christ is supreme, universal, eternal. He comes to rule the earth, lighten burdens of the downtrodden, and liberate human beings from earthly oppressors. More than that, he wants to liberate human hearts. Therefore, Christ is the king, but He is not the king who comes to claim power and majesty. Jesus is the king who comes to establish a new kingdom on earth. Truly, he rejected all shows of earthly power. Instead, the Kingdom of Jesus is love and humility.

Acknowledging Jesus as King should cause us to live the Gospel. Often, we hear his Word and speak about him. We receive his sacred body and blood. Therefore, we should let Jesus reign in our hearts and guide us to dignity, social justice, peace and progress in our world. It is urgent

that we open our hearts to let Jesus establish his kingdom in us. Nowadays, evil is taking over many hearts; manipulating us so that peace, love and dignity are dying within our families and society. The King of Kings lives with us and among us, but we have ignored him and do what we want. Saint Paul says *"For in him were created all things in heaven and on earth, the visible and the invisible, whether thrones or dominions or principalities or powers; all things were created through him and for him."* Nothing is ours. As we have heard his Word proclaimed that *"... all were created through him and for him."* We should recognize his desire to restore our brokenhearted lives because of envy, hatred, revenge, and avarice. It is truly a beautiful sight to behold the **huge** stack of gifts and the festive atmosphere as parishioners bustle about organizing presents in the Church.
