The U.S. Census Bureau is the federal government’s largest statistical agency. We provide current facts and figures about America’s people, places, and economy. Federal law protects the confidentiality of all individual responses the Census Bureau collects.

The U.S. Constitution requires that each decade we take a count or census of America’s population.



The census provides vital information for you and your community.

- It determines how many representatives each state gets in Congress and is used to redraw district boundaries.

**Redistricting counts are sent to the states by March 31, 2021.**

- Communities rely on census statistics to plan for a variety of resident needs including new roads and schools.
- Businesses use census data to determine where to open places to shop.
- Cities/Counties use census data to determine where fire stations, hospitals and emergency services are in your community.

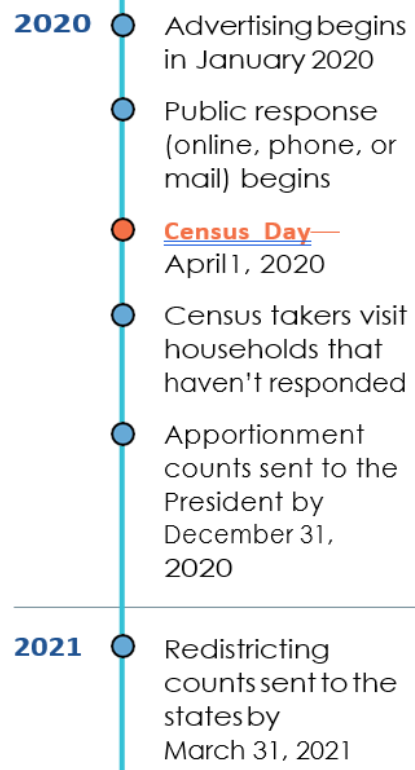
