


Long-time pastor retires from Long Valley church

WASHINGTON TWP. — The Rev. Michael Drury has retired after a quarter century as pastor of St. Luke Parish in Long Valley. Drury has been replaced by Father Owen Moran, pastor at St. Rose of Lima Catholic Church in East Hanover.

Drury joined the parish as its pastor in 1994 and will remain as pastor emeritus. Moran was replaced by Father Matthew Kranc, who was named St. Rose of Lima Church administrator upon Moran's departure. Kranc had served as parochial vicar at St. Rose for many years.

The new parochial vicar is Father Kerwin T. Gaza. Moran gave his last sermon at St. Rose on Sunday, June 8.

Reached for comment, Kranc said the church's Paterson Diocese has prohibited him from discussing the change. "This is administrative, and change will be coming in a few months," he said, adding the diocese wants to keep discussion down until the outcome of

the church's staffing structure and a new pastor has been named.

and a member of the East Hanover Knights of Columbus, said Moran was transferred to St. Luke by Bishop Arthur Serratelli of the Paterson Archdiocese to the Long Valley parish.

"Normally a pastor stays

with a church about eight years," DeMaio said. "Father Owen stayed for 16. He turned the church around. St. Luke is looking for the same magic."

Moran did not immediately return a call to his St. Luke administrative office.

At St. Rose, Moran is no

longer listed on the staff list but a history of the church notes:

"Father Owen B. Moran entered the seminary in 1985 and graduated from St. John's College in Waterford, Ireland with a degree in philosophy, liberal arts, theology and sacred scripture."

"Bishop (Frank) Rodimer appointed Father Moran as the third pastor of St. Rose of Lima on April 3, 2003. Father Owen was officially installed as pastor of St. Rose of Lima by Bishop Frank J. Rodimer on Sunday, Sept. 21, 2003.
