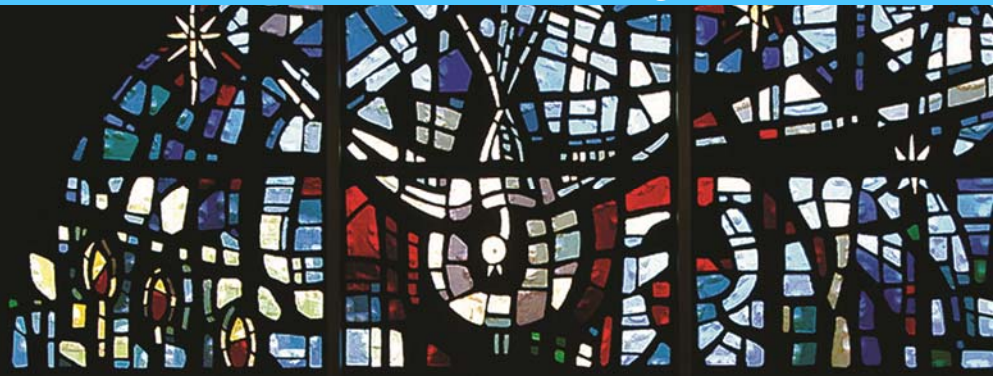

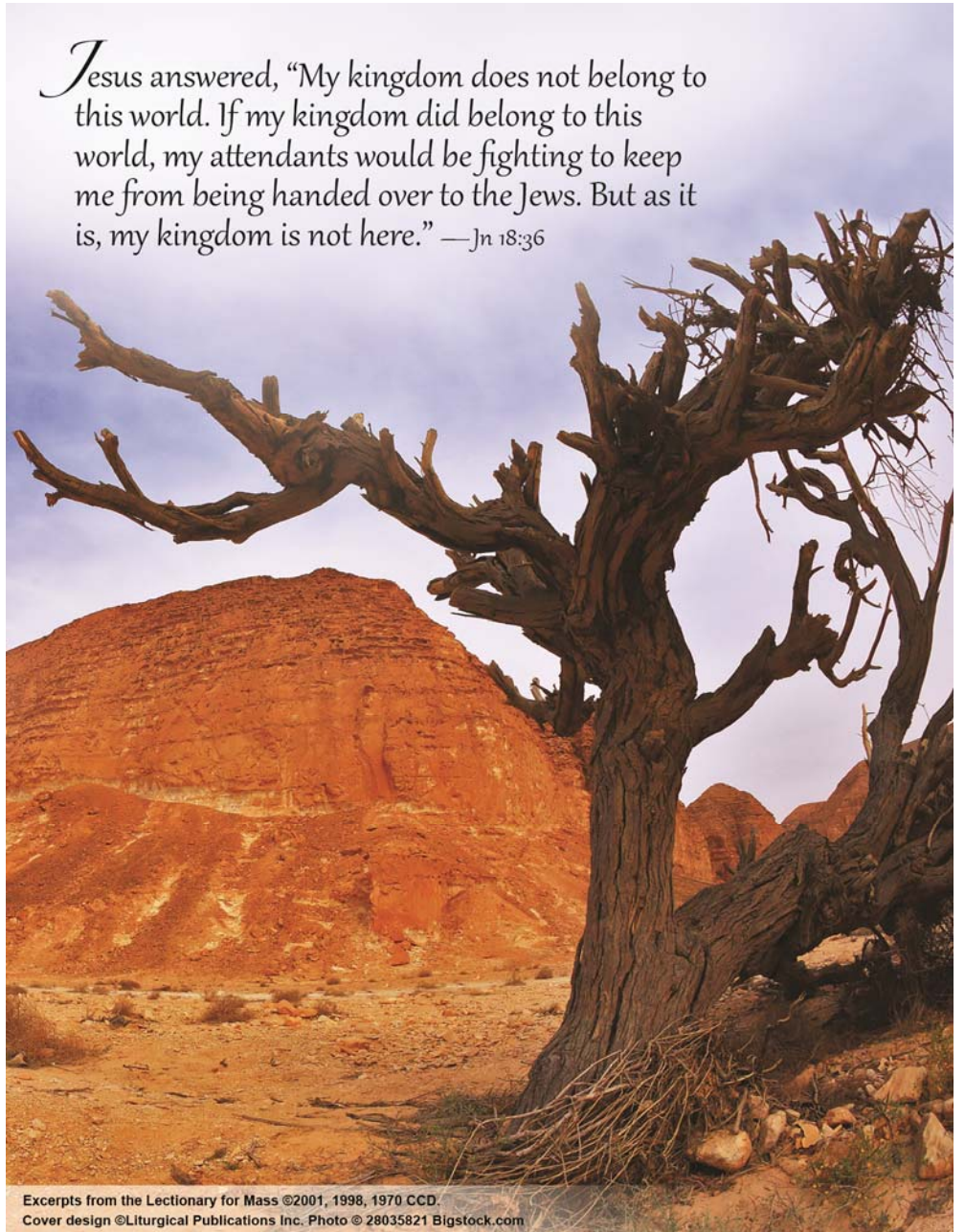

CHRIST THE KING - November 24, 2013

2 Samuel 5: 1-3; Colossians 1: 12-20; Luke 23: 35-43

AN INVITATION TO BE THE IMAGE OF GOD'S SELFLESS LOVE

Today's celebration of the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe proclaims the preeminence and the primacy of Jesus, the Son of God and the Messiah in the life of all believers. This faith is what defines us who we are and influences what we do. The Kingship which stands for the centrality, primacy and the preeminence of Jesus is the starting point as well as the culmination of all of our liturgies. It is worth exploring today the meaning and relevance of this feast for us today.

Let us not forget the socio-political environment of the early part of the 20th century (the Feast of Christ the King was instituted by Pope Pius XI in 1925) which influenced the decision to include this feast in the universal calendar of the Church. It is also important to note that the idea of God's Kingship is very much rooted in the Bible and hence biblical. Israel considered Yahweh as the true King, the one who protected them, led them and provided for them. Why did the Church go back to the Old Testament times to bring back the notion of God's Kingship to the early 20th century world? As we know from our history lessons, the early part of the 20th century was marked by three distinctive phenomena - the end of the First World War, the rise of secularism, and the emergence of extreme ideologies and dangerous dictatorships. Amidst the socio-political unrest and against the backdrop of political ideologies that threatened the very existence of societies and individuals, the Church presented the image of Christ the King. Presenting the image of Christ the King was a prophetic sign and act. Jesus' Kingship is presented as the critique of all the undercurrent phenomena of the social and political unrest of the time. Jesus' Kingship was neither based on politics nor on power, rather on selfless love. Only the power of selfless love, a love that seeks not one's own good but of the other is true, authentic and lasting.

The choice of the gospel passage for this feast presents the mocking, sneering, jeering and reviling of Jesus at the Cross. The teaching of Christ the King from the Cross is clear and loud. It announces that only unconditional and selfless love can truly liberate or free one. The one who acknowledged this love (the repentant thief) on the Cross is also freed, liberated and saved. Only this love has the power to change people and the world. In the backdrop of the dangerous dictatorships and ideologies, the Church presented the power of selfless love. It was this power that changed a hard core criminal hanging by the side of Jesus. It is only this selfless love which can change today's world and societies and not money, military, bombs and missiles. Jesus is not a King of his own making. He is made a King in so far as he lived and witnessed to the selfless love of God. The Second Reading beautifully captures this truth when it affirms, "He is the image of the invisible God". Let us then become the image of the selfless love of Christ on the Cross!

Summary of Comments re: Music:

There is a strong need for uplifting, inspirational, contemporary (post Vatican II), modern music.

Music Liturgy is essential to a thriving parish; All Saints needs to take a serious look at what music liturgy has to offer; maybe different styles to accommodate different tastes, e.g., chamber music may not resonate with families.

More resources need to be committed to music.

Need more music that is current and “singable” like that at the school masses; a strong music liturgy that appeals to families.

Music should encourage participation, songs should be familiar, sung often enough to be learned.

More connection to school band; Consider creation of a school choir.

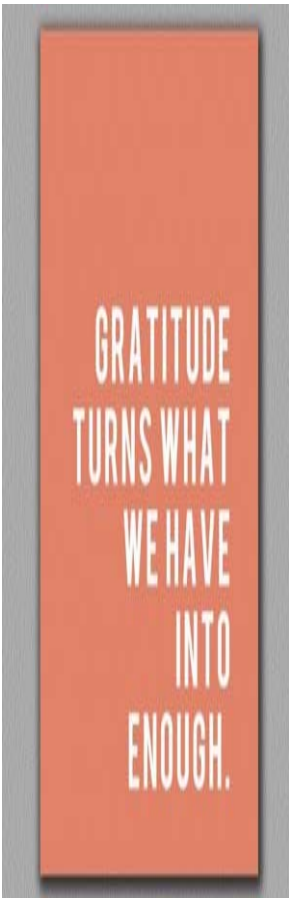

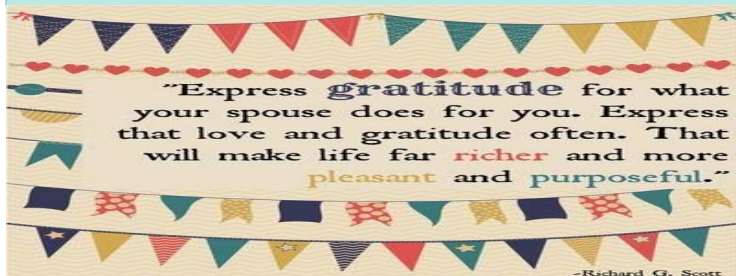
