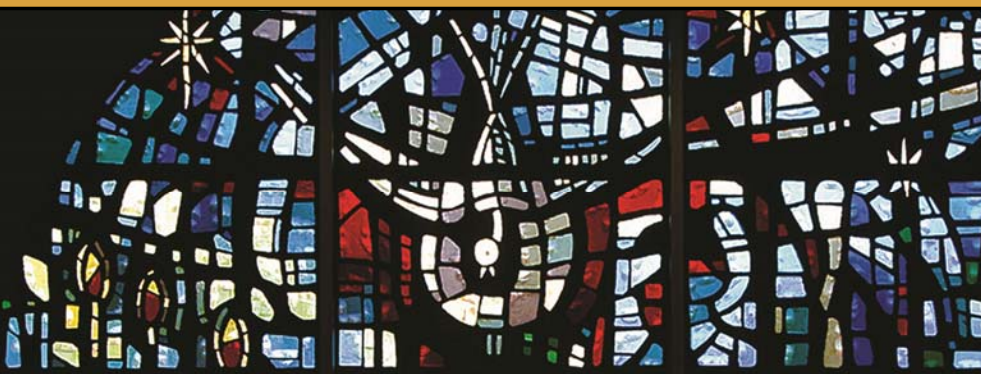
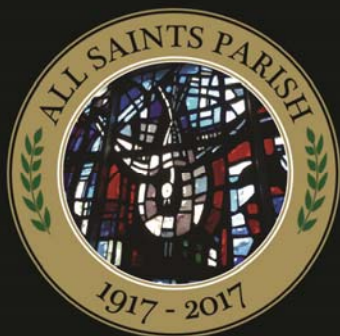

REFLECTION OF THE WEEK

September 29, 2019—26th Sunday in Ordinary Time

If you saw someone dead come to life tomorrow, what would you change about your life? Would you say “nothing”? That’s what Jesus seems to hope. After all, we already know what to do. In this Sunday’s Gospel, a rich man and a poor man pass away, the former to damnation and the latter to peaceful rest alongside the Jewish patriarchs. The rich man asks if the poor man can appear to his brothers and advise them to live a more virtuous life. The parable offers a strong rebuke: *“They have Moses and the prophets. Let them listen to them.”* In other words, they should already know what to do.

We, too, know what to do. More than Moses, Jesus Christ himself has spoken, and continues to speak through his Church. The rich man did not heed the wise words, despite knowing them. If we are convicted against certain Christian teachings in our heart, how much good will miraculous “proofs” do? We know more than the law and the prophets — we know the prophetic law of love proclaimed by Jesus Christ. Are we living like we believe it?

Where in our lives are we like the rich man? Do we know how to treat the poor but still we ignore them in our excess? Do we know the third commandment, but the Sunday liturgy feels “optional” when other weekend commitments arise? Have we heard Christ’s teachings on sexuality, but consider them out of reach for us? We have received a great many truths as Christian people. We are blessed by God with the sacraments and the abundance of His graces. We have what we need — in Him — to begin to live a virtuous life *now*.

26th Sunday in Ordinary Time—On September 27th, the Church celebrated the feast of St. Vincent de Paul, who knew that “God had sent him to bring good news to the poor.” Together with your gifts, the members of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul continue his work and mission in our parish.

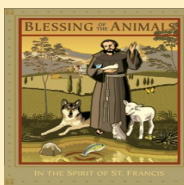

2018/2019 GIVING REPORT

Through your donations, coordination and encouragement, every student at All Saints experienced the gift of giving. **THANK YOU!**

All grades and their families made over 450 lunches for women in the Catholic Charities Housing Transitions Program; raised \$15,569 through Chloe's Crusaders for Cystic Fibrosis research; donated \$1,466 for the India Project and \$1,625.29 with Rice Bowl collections.



PRE-K: SUNSHINE PROJECT

New this year was Pre-K's Sunshine Project. Tasked with spreading happiness, good wishes, and prayers to faculty, staff and students, they coordinated surprise birthday celebrations, delivered cards to people fighting illness and made Valentines. They even prayed together to Saint Anthony to help find lost items at school and thanks to their efforts, phones, car keys and books were found!

KINDERGARTEN: OUR NEIGHBORHOOD COMMUNITY

Kindergarten created placemats for Portland VA Medical Center patients; made valentines for Laurelhurst Village residents; and delivered flower bouquets to neighbors on Laddington Ct.

1ST GRADE: ART FOR THE HEART

Families donated more than 50 toys to the Randall Children's Hospital this year. They also collected 200 art supplies for Ronald McDonald House who had run out of materials.

2ND GRADE: BOOKS BUILD BRIDGES

Second grade held a school-wide book drive to benefit The Children's Book Bank to improve early literacy. With the help of the All Saints community, they collected over 2,000 children's books in the hopes that more kids will have access to bedtime stories and can learn to read.

3RD GRADE: CARING FOR THE ELDERLY

Each month students made cards for Laurelhurst Village residents, a nearby senior living facility. They also had the opportunity to visit and sing songs.

4TH GRADE: FEEDING THE HUNGRY

What a great response this year in creating Hungry Helping Packs! Families collected supplies and packed 200 snack bags.

5TH GRADE: KIDS HELPING KIDS

Students and families collected 150 coats, 100 hats, 80 scarves and 90 pairsof mittens for Northwest Children's Outreach. They also collected for Project Lemonade and donated 250 books and 325 pairs of new socks benefiting local foster youth.

6TH GRADE: FRIEND-TO-FRIEND

Sixth grade students and their parents visited and spent time with friends at Providence's Center for Medically Frag-ile Children.

7TH GRADE: CALLED TO DISCIPLESHIP

Seventh grade students gave 112 hours of service, donated \$1,148 and collected 728 items for 12 agencies or projects that included: Oregon Humane Society, Project Lemonade, St. Vincent de Paul @ Our Lady of the Lake, Crib Project, Friends of Trees, Paying it Forward Store, Crayola Colorcycle, PAWS, Save the Bees, Pongo Fund, Snowcap, and the Archdiocese of Portland.

8TH GRADE: ST. VINCENT DE PAUL

During the school year the 8th grade led five all-school food drives to benefit our **All Saints St. Vincent de Paul** food pantry that serves our neighbors in need. Donations of food and household items totaled over 2,600 pounds! And over \$700 were collected at the Christmas Pageant.
