

SISTER DOLORES CIRINO

(July 1, 1900 - May 5, 1980)

At Providence Rest, Bronx, New York, Sr. Dolores (Addolorata) passed to her eternal reward on May 5, 1980. Age: 79 Religion: 55

Sr. Dolores, christened Rosina Cirino, was born in Solofro, Italy on July 12, 1900. Rosina left her native land as a secular and arrived in America in August 1920.

On August 2, 1924, Rosina entered in Staten Island and then was received on February 8, 1925 as Sister Addolorata (Dolores).

From the year of her first profession, 1926 to 1964, Sister accepted in the spirit of gentleness and humility the task of cleaning. In a period of thirty-eight years, Sister served at St. John Villa Academy, Mt. St. John Convent, Providence Rest, Our Lady of Loreto and St. James. Sister performed her daily responsibilities with utmost diligence, but all for the honor and glory of God. She is most especially remembered by many Sisters as one who continuously worked in the laundry room.

In January 1964, Sister became physically unable to perform her duties because of parkinson disease. Therefore, she retired to Mt. St. John Convent in White Plains. This necessitated physical therapy which meant a transfer to Providence Rest in 1965. Unfortunately, she did not improve and eventually became bedridden. Sister suffered a great deal until the Lord called her to share in His kingdom.
