

SR. ELIZABETH MILITANO
February 28, 1919 – October 19, 2007

Sr. Elizabeth (Concetta) Militano was born on February 28, 1919 in Bridgeport, Connecticut. Fifty-four years of Sister's life were lived as a Sister of St. John the Baptist.

During these years Sister Elizabeth was engaged in teaching elementary school, religious instruction as well as in parish and domestic services in various houses of the American Province in New York and New Jersey, Pennsylvania and Connecticut. Sister also ministered on the foreign missions in Santiago, Chile and Kitwe in Zambia, Africa.

Gifted with extraordinary talent in working with her hands, Sr. Elizabeth was an excellent seamstress, excelling as well in the culinary arts. Many lay people whom Sister came to meet in her various ministries were the recipients of Sister's encouraging, prayerful assurances and smiles of compassion. Sister was faithful to many private devotions especially devotion to Jesus in His salvific passion and death, to our Blessed Mother Mary and to our Founder Blessed Alfonso Maria Fusco.

God called Sister Elizabeth to her eternal reward On October 19, 2007 after she suffered briefly but very painfully with cancer of the liver.
