

**SR. JULIANA TRETOLA, C.S.JB.
SISTERS OF ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST**

Sr. Juliana was born on July 28, 1914 in North Bergen, New Jersey. She entered the Community of the Sisters of St. John the Baptist on September 17, 1933 and received the habit on September 8, 1934.

Upon first profession on September 9, 1935, until 1961, Sr. Juliana served in the teaching apostolates in both parish and community owned schools: Our Lady of Loreto, New York City; St. John Villa Academy, Staten Island; St. James, New York City; and Mt. St. John Academy, Gladstone, New Jersey. In 1961 Sr. Juliana assumed the position of Principal for one year at St. Lucy, Newark, New Jersey. From 1962 to 1968, Sr. Juliana was principal of St. Roch School, Greenwich, Connecticut as well as Superior of the convent. Sister continued her service to God's people at Providence Rest Nursing Home, Bronx, New York in the capacity of Director of Personnel from 1968 to 1991.

Sister Juliana earned a BS and MS Degree from Fordham University in 1944 and 1954 respectively. She also studied Library Science at Catholic University.

After suffering a stroke during the week of December, 28th, 1992, Sister was admitted to Our Lady of Mercy Hospital, Bronx, New York, where she remained until her death on January 19, 1993.

Sr. Juliana was a religious who deeply loved God and her Instiute and strove to be faithful to both. Her whole person was permeated by a gentleness of the Spirit. We pray like her, we may grow each day closer to the the Lord.
