Dear Parishioners of St. Elizabeth:

I trust that all of you remain well during this time of uncertainty. There are many in our community who are impacted by Covid-19. Some have lost their jobs, and unsure how they will provide for their families.

The recent "Stay at Home" order has affected you, Fr. Doug and me. It grieves us that we are unable to offer the sacraments of Confession and Holy Communion to you, but please rest assured you are remembered in our daily Masses and personal prayers.

The past two weekend collections dropped substantially; the collection for March 29 dropped by roughly 75% in comparison to an average weekend. If this trend continues, this equates to offertory collections over the course of a month totaling collections over a normal weekend. The parish still has financial obligations that need to be paid. We are doing our very best to be good stewards of the gifts entrusted to us by keeping expenses at a minimum; we have reduced overhead and staff expenses, as well as priest salaries, and will continue to cut expenses where we are able to.
