**WEEKLY HOMILY / HOMILÍA SEMANAL****Twenty-Seventh Sunday OT/Vigésimo Séptimo Domingo T.O. Ciclo/Cycle A**

My Dear Brothers and sisters, today's Gospel is a very good example of the love of God toward us. Christ in this passage of the gospel give to us a parable to see what is the intention of our heart, like he did to the Pharisees. They believed they were just and upright, but his justice was inflexible. Even though Christ shows us again His Father's justice. Humanly speaking, what it should be done to those wicked tenants of today's gospel, is to kill them, they were liars, thieves and murderers. But, God is not like us. The owner of the vineyard that did not grow weary of sending messengers to those wicked tenants to get what was his and lately send his only son, He did not give way to his anger, but seeing those tenants getting lost in their eagerness to possess the vineyard, and did not recognize the Father's love for them. For this reason, God send his only son to die for all of us, because, we are depositories of God's goods, and because of our sins, we believe we were entitled to possess those goods. So we have been wicked administrators and we have spent them badly. The Good News is, that the enormous debt that we have with God has been canceled through the death of the innocent one, Jesus Christ. This is how God does justice, the innocent pays for the wicked, so we can obtain our justification of our sins, and as consequence, receive Eternal Life. May God bless you always.

Mis queridos hermanos, el Evangelio de este domingo es un claro ejemplo del amor de Dios. Este Señor de la viña que no se cansaba de mandar mensajeros y por ultimo mando a su único hijo, no se dejó llevar por la ira, sino que viendo a los viñadores perdidos en su afán por tener, no pudieron reconocer el amor de su Señor. Por esto, Dios envió a su hijo a morir por todos nosotros, ya que nosotros que hemos sido estos depositarios de los bienes de Dios y que por nuestros pecados nos hemos apropiado indebidamente de ellos y no hemos sido buenos administradores sino que los hemos malgastado. La buena noticia es que esta deuda ha sido cancelada por Cristo, él, el Hijo único ha pagado todas nuestras faltas. ## TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Before long, as we've seen, the four newly constructed Eucharistic Prayers became two. The old Roman Canon faded away into relative disuse after 1600 unbroken years, sometimes heard only at Christmas Midnight Mass or the Easter Vigil. The new Eucharistic Prayer IV, at least in its English form, grates a bit on most hearers, and besides is meant only for Ordinary Time. The reconstruction of the ancient prayer of Hippolytus, Eucharistic Prayer II, is the most familiar, but its brevity sometimes creates an imbalance with the Liturgy of the Word. No wonder that as soon as the creative juices began to flow at the Vatican, people worldwide were trying their hands at new prayers.

In 1967, even before the final shape of the new Mass was announced, bishops were asking to adapt that celebration for the needs of children. They wanted to clarify what ought to happen when large numbers of children are at Mass: what could be adapted, omitted, or shortened. Experimentation had already begun. Separate Liturgies of the Word for children were by this time commonplace in Holland and elsewhere in Europe. Catechists were saying that many of our liturgical forms were too complex for the children in their charge, and priests were making adaptations on their own. ## TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

La Virgen María tiene siglos de estar apareciéndose a los cristianos. Aún antes de que fuese asunta al cielo, ella ya se le había aparecido al apóstol Santiago en Zaragoza, España. Según una antigua leyenda, Santiago llegó a tierra española en el año 40 para predicar el Evangelio. Tuvo poco éxito y desanimado pensaba sacudirse de los pies el polvo de aquella tierra y buscar convertir otras gentes. Mientras estaba en oración, María, la madre de Jesús, se le apareció con palabras de consuelo, ánimo y un pequeño obsequio. Le dio una imagen de ella misma sobre un pilar y con el Niño Jesús en brazos.

En esa tierra ella pidió la construcción de un templo donde ella misma sería altar para la gloria de Dios. Santiago mismo construyó la primera iglesia donde hoy se encuentra una gran basílica en honor de Nuestra Señora del Pilar. En el siglo XVIII, el Papa Clemente XII declaró el 12 de octubre como su fiesta en memoria de la llegada de los europeos al continente americano.
