WEEKLY HOMILY / HOMILÍA SEMANAL**Seventh Sunday of Easter /Séptimo Domingo de Pascua**


I begin by wishing the moms here a Happy Mother's Day. I am offering this Mass for our moms, whether they are present with us or far away, whether they are living or deceased. Today is a beautiful day to remember our moms and to pray for them. Today's readings present the possibility of a filial relationship with God. Filial refers to intimacy and trust that can exist between parent and child. In today's Gospel, Jesus tells us that if someone keeps Jesus' word, "the Father will love him." He then describes an intimacy, impossible for us to imagine. He tells us that he and the Father will dwell within us - by the power of the Holy Spirit. This intimacy has a high price. You know that one of the most painful things in this life is the physical separation from someone we love. Some of us have experienced that in relation to our mom - or some other much loved person. Jesus tells us today the reason for separation - so that we might have an even more intimate union. The disciples were devastated by the death of Jesus, but then came the great miracle of the Resurrection. In this intimate expression of friendship, the relationship between Jesus and His followers changed radically. No longer are they servants or slaves, but friends. Nothing is to be hidden from each other; there is equality. An intimate relationship with God, our spouses, and our friends requires that we realize that such a bond demands sharing with them our joys and disappointments, for the other is important to our life experience. It demands communication. We cannot know God if we do not spend time in prayer, just as we cannot know our spouse or our friends if we do not speak to them. Strong intimate relationships do not happen in five minutes, but overtime. We must remember that for any relationship to flourish and grow, we must be open to change and growth for and with the one with whom we are intimate. If we are intimate with Jesus, we will be able to change to his way, truth and life. Now, Jesus explains that he must once again go from their sight. He does it for a reason: so that he can send the Advocate. That word means the one who stands up for us, like an attorney or a lawyer. Jesus calls the Holy Spirit to make possible an intimate union with the Trinity - the Father, Son and Holy Spirit

Empiezo con el deseo que todas las mamás aquí tengan un Feliz Día de la Madre. Ofrezco la misa por nuestras madres, las presentes y las que están lejos, las que viven y las que están ya disfrutando de nuestro Padre Celestial. Hoy es un día lindo para recordar a nuestras madres y rezar por ellas. Las lecturas de hoy nos presentan la posibilidad de una relación filial con Dios. Filial refiere a la intimidad y confianza que puede existir entre padre e hijo. Nos dice que él y su Padre harán su morada en nosotros - por el poder del Espíritu Santo. Esta intimidad tiene un precio alto. Ustedes saben que uno de las cosas más dolorosas en esta vida es la separación de alguien muy querido. Algunos lo habéis experimentado con vuestra mamá - u otro ser muy querido. Jesús nos dice hoy el motivo de separación - para tener una unión aun más íntima. Los discípulos estaban destrozados por la muerte de Jesús, pero después vino el gran milagro de la Resurrección. En esta íntima expresión de amistad, la relación tan íntima de Cristo con sus discípulos cambia ahora radicalmente. Ya no hay siervos o esclavos, sino solamente amigos. No hay nada que esconderse los unos a los otros, solamente hay igualdad entre ellos. Una relación de intimidad, o una relación íntima con Dios, con nuestros esposos, o esposas, o con los amigos requiere y supone que en esta relación, nos obliga a que haya un compartir nuestras alegrías y nuestras tristezas, por que el otro es importante para nuestra experiencia de la vida. Esto, nos obliga a que se dé una comunicación. No podemos conocer a Dios sino hay oración, como no podemos conocer a nadie sino hablamos con esa persona en la que estamos interesados. Debemos recordar siempre, que para que una relación crezca y se fortalezca, tenemos que estar abiertos a los cambios que puedan producirse con quien se tiene intimidad. Ahora, Jesús explica que otra vez tiene que salir de su vista. Lo hace por un motivo: para enviar el Consolador. El Espíritu Santo hace posible una unión íntima con la Trinidad - Padre, Hijo y Espíritu Santo. Que Dios me los bendiga siempre.

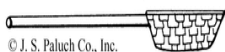

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

In Ireland and the United Kingdom, Mother's Day is over. "Mothering Sunday" was on the Fourth Sunday of Lent. Long ago, people were freed from work to travel on this day to the parish where they were baptized, their "Mother Church." Often, people were reunited with their mothers on this day. Employers would release their workers and servants for this visit. The American celebration, while based on this custom, really has to do with an anti-war movement of mothers in Civil War times. They crusaded for better sanitary conditions for their sons. When President Wilson instituted the first Mother's Day in 1912, it was a day to fly the flag in honor of mothers whose children had died in battle. Knowing the tradition is a good balance to our celebration today. We can enfold in prayer the mothers who have suffered the loss of their children in war --Rev. James Field, Copyright (c) J. S. TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

El día 15 de mayo los campesinos de Ichocán, Perú adornan sus yugos, y las puertas de sus casas con el fruto de sus cosechas en honor a san Isidro Labrador. Muchos países Latinoamericanos celebran esta fiesta. En un continente donde la agricultura es tan importante no hay que sorprenderse de la importancia de este santo español del siglo XII. Además san Isidro se parece a mucha gente de Latinoamérica: es de padres campesinos, de familia pobre y religiosa, no fue a la escuela, quedó huérfano y se empleó como peón de campo, ayudando en la agricultura. Se casó con María la cual también llegó a ser santa. Tuvieron un hijo. Los tres fueron reconocidos como piadosos y generosos. Gracias a Dios, la santidad se encuentra en todo tipo de persona. Los casados y padres y madres de familia también llegan a ser santos. Después de su muerte en 1130 se descubrió que su cuerpo estaba milagrosamente incorrupto. En 1622 el Papa canonizó a este humilde campesino junto con algunos grandes religiosos como santa Teresa, san Ignacio y san Francisco Javier.
