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**WEEKLY HOMILY / HOMILÍA SEMANAL**


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**Tenth Sunday O.T./Décimo Domingo T.O.**

Who are my Mother and my brothers? I believe in my humble opinion, that this sentence it is the core of today's gospel. After Jesus did a miracle of restoring the hand of a man on the Sabbath, he has been criticized and judged by the Pharisees, who started saying that Jesus did the miracles by the finger of Beelzebub, which gives way to all this dialogue and confrontation between Jesus and the Pharisees. After this dialogue, appeared Jesus' mother and brothers wanted to speak with him and Jesus answered them with this amazing sentence: "Who are my mother and brothers? But those who do my Father's will." Jesus was followed by many people, among them, there were Pharisees, with their institutionalisms and laws that could not be moved, but they did not fulfill God's will. Others that followed Jesus were those against the system, those who did not follow the law of Yahve because it was obsolete, and they too wanted to change it or transform it, seeing in Jesus this guy who can reinvented. Others one was those who followed him because it was trending, everybody goes, so I go, but it did not affect me. But, there is another group who follow Jesus, this group was those who want to do God's will. So, to which group you belong? To the group that do not want and for sure you do not like any change and renovation in the church and criticized any movement that bring in some changes and persecute them. Or perhaps, to the group that want that the church should look like our society and change all the structure because it is obsolete and does not help much to the needs of the modern man and woman. Or maybe you belong to the group that think that I go to the church because I have nothing else to do or because it is trendy to go in order to continuous the family tradition and so I can have my brunch in peace, and nothing worst or bad could happened to me or my family or possessions. But it could happen that there are some who really want to convert, for them this final sentence of today's gospel it is fundamental, who are my mother and brothers? Those who do my Father's will. To this is God calling us today, not simple to submit blindly my will to God's, but to do it out of love for him, without trying to change it or modifying it to my wish or Desiree, so that, I could be his mother, carrying him inside me and be one with Christ or to be his brother bringing him and let him be known to the rest of the people. May God bless you always.

¿Quiénes son mi madre y mis hermanos? Yo creo, en mi humilde opinión, que este es el centro del evangelio de hoy. Ya que Jesús, después de hacer un milagro de sanación de la mano de un hombre en el Sabbath, es criticado y juzgado por los fariseos, que comenzaron a decir, que, si era por el dedo de belcebú que Cristo curaba, lo que da pie a todo este dialogo confrontación, entre Jesús y los fariseos. Y después de todo este dialogo, aparecen la madre y los hermanos de Jesús, al final de este evangelio, queriendo hablar con el. Y Jesús, responde con esta sentencia tan fantástica: "¿Quiénes Son mi madre y mis hermanos? sino aquellos que hacen la voluntad de mi Padre" A Jesús lo seguían y escuchaban mucha gente, entre ellos, fariseos, con su institucionalismos y leyes que solo les satisfacían a ellos mismos, pero no cumplían la voluntad de Yahveh. Otros de los que seguían a Jesús eran los anti sistema, aquellos que no aguantaban la ley y querían cambiarla por que era demasiado para ellos, otro grupo, eran los que iban por que todos lo seguían. Pero hay un cuarto grupo que seguía a Cristo por que querían hacer la voluntad de Dios. Entonces yo le preguntaría a cada uno de ustedes, ¿a que grupo pertenecen? Al de los que quieren una institución inamovible, que se escandalizan con los cambios y no aguantan la renovación que trae el Espíritu Santo en la iglesia y critican y persiguen todo lo que es nuevo. O a lo mejor son del grupo que quieren reformar todo y dicen que la iglesia esta anticuada y hay que renovarla de acuerdo con el tiempo en que vivimos y tiene que parecerse mas a la sociedad actual y todo hay que cambiarlo. O quizás, al grupo de voy por que no tengo nada mejor que hacer y para seguir tranquilo y sin problemas voy a la misa y así me dejan tranquilo. Pero puede ser que haya alguno que si quiera convertirse. Por esto la frase final del evangelio es fundamental. ¿Quiénes son mi Madre y mis hermanos? Los que hacen la voluntad de mi Padre. A esto nos esta llamando el Señor hoy, no a someter ciegamente mi voluntad, sino a hacer la voluntad de Dios por amor a Él, sin intentar cambiar o modifica la voluntad de Dios a mi antojo y parecer, y así, ser Madre de Dios, por que lo llevamos dentro y somos uno con Cristo, o también, siendo hermanos de Jesús por que se lo daremos a conocer a los demás. Que Dios me los bendiga siempre.

### A CATHOLIC PHILOSOPHY OF LIFE

Four lectures given by Msgr. Richard Liddy, Director of the Center for Catholic Studies at Seton Hall University. The lectures will take place on four **Thursdays in the summer at 7 pm; June 14, June 28, July 5 and August 2** – and will take place at Stafford Hall at Seton Hall. (Park in the Parking Garage and walk a short distance to Stafford Hall). All of us live by some philosophy, whether we know it or not. These four lectures will present a Catholic vision of life inspired by the work of Bernard Lonergan, S. J. (1904–1984) and his writings on human consciousness. Lonergan was a Canadian Jesuit theologian whose works have had a worldwide influence. Participants will be asked to identify the elements of a Catholic and catholic, that is, wholistic, vision in their own experiences. “The audience I envision for these lectures are the people getting off the train each day from New York City in South Orange and surrounding towns and involved in various professions - business, law, etc. - as well as ordinary folk open to such questions as: Who am I? ### TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The cathedral is a treasure in a diocese and in our tradition. It is not simply a "big church," as some say; some parish churches are larger. What makes a cathedral is the presence of the chair, called a cathedra (Latin for seat) reserved for the bishop. There are many instances in our country of a local church (diocese) outgrowing a cathedral. In Baltimore and St. Louis, the former cathedrals are historic treasures in the heart of the old city, but new and larger structures now function as the seat of the bishop.

When a bishop dies or retires, it is said that "the seat is vacant," and when the new bishop is installed, the central ritual is the moment when the decree of the Holy Father is read and the new bishop is escorted to the cathedra. No one but the bishop sits in the cathedra during a ritual, but in Los Angeles the cathedra in the Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels is accessible, and no one seems to mind when a visitor tries the cathedra out for the bishop's point of view .

Somos granos de trigo que, unidos formamos el pan de la comunión que es comunidad. Para esto, cada uno debe morir a sus egoísmos y preferencias. Morir a sí mismo tiene sentido cristiano, sólo si es para trabajar unidos y en la misión de Cristo, la cual es salvación del mundo y construcción del Reino de Dios.
