WEEKLY HOMILY / HOMILÍA SEMANAL

Fifth Sunday of Easter/ Quinto Domingo de Pascua

Jesus today gives us a new commandment: "That we should love one another as he loved us." To love has several dimensions, and today I would like to underlaying one of them. To love mean to enter into a respectful relationship with the other person. For example, consider the relationship Father-Son. The Paternal love imply protection, counseling, meanwhile the relationship Son-Father imply honor, obedience, respect. And so, in all other kind of relationships. We can see the worries for the right relationships in the reading of the acts of the apostles. The Apostles , not only wanted to give the correct teaching to the people, but, they were worried about the correct relationship of the Christian communities, meanwhile the were going traveling from one community to another, for this reason, they appointed "Presbyters." The presbyter could have been a young guy like Timothy, to whom St. Paul put in charge of the Church at Efeso. The word Presbyter mean elder, but it is not the only meaning. At the end of the first Century, the Christians developed a three level or orders structure, bishop, presbyter, and deacon. It is like that for us today. Today we can say that no priest or deacon could function without the bishop, so to have a correct relationship is essential part of our live, and it is too for love. May God bless you always.

Hoy Jesús nos da un nuevo mandamiento: que nos amemos como él nos ama. Amor tiene muchas dimensiones. Jamás puedo resumir el significado de amor en una sola homilía o aun en mil homilías. Este domingo quisiera enfocar en un aspecto de amor - no es el cuento total, pero una parte esencial. Amor significa estar en una relación correcta con la otra persona. Considera la relación entre padre e hijo. El amor paternal para un hijo implica protección y consejos, mientras el amor del hijo para su padre implica honor y obediencia. Así es en todas nuestra relaciones - puede ser del maestro y alumno, hermana mayor y hermano menor, abuelo y nieto, marido y esposa. Amor incluye el descubrimiento de los elementos de una relación correcta - vivirlas. Podemos ver la preocupación para relaciones correctas en la lectura de los Hechos. Los apóstoles no solamente querían dar enseñanza correcta a la gente; también se preocupaban de relaciones correctas dentro de la comunidad. Mientras iban de un lugar a otro "designaban presbíteros." Presbítero puede significar anciano, pero no es el único sentido. El presbítero podía ser alguien joven como Timoteo a quien Pablo encargó la iglesia importante de Efeso. Al final del primer siglo los cristianos habían desarrollado una estructura con tres niveles o ordenes: obispo, presbítero y diácono. Los primeros cristianos querían estar en relación correcta con su obispos, sus sacerdotes y sus diáconos. Así es para nosotros. Pues, algunos de ustedes están pensando que estoy diciéndoles esto porque hoy es Domingo de Compromiso para la Petición Católica Anual. Tienen razón. Pero quizás estoy predicando más a mi mismo que a ustedes. Admito que a veces estoy tentado a pensar que tenemos tantas necesidades en nuestra parroquia, ¿por qué hacer una colecta para el arzobispo? La verdad es que ningún sacerdote y ningún diácono puede funcionar aparte de su obispo. Estar en una relación correcta es una parte esencial de vida y de amor. Y desde aquella relación recibimos beneficios para nosotros y para los necesitados. Hoy les invito expresar su amor en la colecta, ya que la parroquia necesita de su ayuda para hacer unos arreglos muy necesarios, yo apelo a su generosidad de corazón. Que Dios me los bendiga siempre.

**TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION**

Frequent fliers today have many ways to accrue air miles, so one doesn't always have to endure long hours in cramped seats to earn free hours in cramped seats. In St. Paul's day, there were no such perks, nor would there have been any legal system for him to protest the shipwrecks he endured. He had other rewards in mind. The churches that he established in the catalogue of cities from today's first reading must have been very different from one another. Language, culture, customs, religious history, obstacles to community, social challenges, the places where they met, their clothing, their bread and wine, all distinct, particular to the area. There were social customs as well: in a Christian household, the only place where a slave would be able to stand legally as an equal with the master would be at the table of the Lord, because at that table a new world of reconciliation was imaged. While Paul revered local customs, he was relentless about challenging the ways that people lived their Christian lives and how their worship reflected them. It is much the same today, as a global Catholic Church seeks to respect local customs and culture, allowing for differences in many things, yet always giving expression to the underlying presence of Christ, who binds us all together into his body.

TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

El primer día de mayo es reconocido como el día mundial del trabajo y conmemora seis mártires de Chicago, quienes fueron fusilados en 1886 cuando la policía trató de impedir una pelea campal durante una huelga de obreros. Curiosamente esta fecha no es reconocida por los Estados Unidos pero sí por muchos países latinoamericanos. En 1954, el Papa Pío XII apoyó los derechos del obrero incluyendo a san José Obrero en el calendario cristiano. Esta fiesta celebra y recuerda la doctrina social de la Iglesia católica, una doctrina que insiste que: El mensaje cristiano no aparta a las personas de la edificación del mundo, ni les lleva a despreocuparse del bien de sus semejantes, sino que les impone esta colaboración como un deber (Gaudium et Spes 34).

Es justo conmemorar a san José como obrero en el día mundial del trabajado, porque este santo varón nos recuerda que al trabajar uno colabora con Dios en la creación continua del mundo y de la humanidad. El trabajo no sólo es derecho humano es una responsabilidad que se debe tomar con amor al prójimo.
